We will be running an Art Competition for students as well as creating a 'Travel Board' to acknowledge close friends and family members who have visited or lived in a French speaking country.

ART COMPETITION

Create a piece of artwork inspired by:

Years Rec/1/2/3 - A place you can visit in Paris (e.g. The Eiffel Tower, The Arc de Triomphe, The Notre Dame Cathedral, The Louvre, The River Seine, The Sacré-Cœur, The Champs-Élysées).

Years 4/5/6/7 – A French artist (e.g. Claude Monet, Pierre-Auguste Renoir, Henri Matisse).

Students can draw, paint, collage, use digital media or create a model.

Please fill out and attach the form below to your child's artwork and then hand it to their classroom teacher by Tuesday 3 July (Wk 10). All submitted pieces will be displayed in the school library for students and their families to enjoy on French Day.

TRAVEL BOARD

It is always wonderful to hear when our students, families and staff have visited, lived in or are even from a French speaking country. This year for French Day we will be creating a 'Travel Board' on the pinup board opposite the Canteen.
