

Early Entry Programs for 2025 Entry



ACU Guarantee Program

Open to domestic and onshore international students

Requirements: Year 12 pass and no ATAR required; no English prerequisite, however additional prerequisites such as a maths or science etc. may be required, depending on the course being applied for.

Guarantee your place at ACU, even before your Year 12 exams. The ACU Guarantee program offers eligible Year 12 students a place at ACU based on your Year 11 results.

Students can make an application through this program, have their Year 11 results considered, and ACU will produce a predicted selection rank and make a conditional early offer before final exams have been sat.

Applications for 2025 open on 22 July and close 16 September 2024. Students are required to apply through the ACU Guarantee application portal on the ACU website and may only apply for 1 course. Students will have to upload their Year 11 reports and may provide up to three personal statements (maximum 200 words each) outlining their circumstances and motivation for university study. Statements will be assessed based on impact through *empathy*, *adversity*, and *family*. Students need to be mindful that not every course will be participating in this program, and each state has different requirements for the guarantee. **Students must also make a VTAC/UAC application.**

Year 12 Early Guaranteed Offer Scheme

Open to domestic and onshore international students

Requirements: Year 12 pass, meet VCE prerequisites, and no ATAR required

Bond University's Year 12 Early Guaranteed Offer Scheme recognises the challenges students have faced over the past few years of senior schooling. Eligible students can receive an offer to study at Bond in 2025 before final ATAR results are released, providing certainty about your future study options.

How it works

1. Students complete Bond's direct [online application](#), submitting results from Year 11, and Semester 1 of Year 12.
2. Bond University will assess the application and school grades against the minimum entry requirements for Bond's undergraduate* and diploma programs (*excludes medical program).
3. Students who meet the entry requirements will receive an offer that guarantees entry to Bond conditional only on the completion of Year 12 and meeting any subject pre-requisite requirements for the specific program.
4. Once students successfully complete their Year 12 and pass any required prerequisite subjects, the offer will become unconditional.

Open to domestic and PR students only

Requirements: Year 12 pass, meet VCE prerequisite course entry requirements, no ATAR required

Want a guaranteed offer to study your preferred Uni course before your final exams? Our Charles Sturt Advantage early offer program is your chance to get into Uni based on work you've already done and skills you already have.

Australian and PR students are eligible to apply, and must address the following three questions:

- How a Charles Sturt degree will enable you to be a positive influence in your community.
- When you showed resilience during a difficult time.
- A time when you demonstrated empathy and why you took the actions you did.

There are more than 50 courses on offer, and students can list up to three in their application.

Applications open on 1 May 2024 and close on 31 August 2024. Offers will be made in late July and September 2023. **Students must also make a VTAC/UAC application.**

Deakin Regional Access Scheme

Open to domestic and PR students only

Requirements: Year 12 pass, meet VCE prerequisites, and a minimum ATAR of 50.00

Deakin offers the Deakin Regional Access Scheme, a pathway to undergraduate study. It allows students to secure an early conditional offer, before ATARs are released by looking at their skills, experience, and achievements.

The scheme is open to current and recent Year 12 students looking to study at the *Waterfront*, *Waurin Ponds* or *Warrnambool* campuses – and, students do not have to live in a regional area to be eligible

It's perfect for students who want to achieve their best, free from the expectations of exams.

The Deakin Regional Access Scheme allows the university to look beyond a student's ATAR to recognise all the skills, experience and achievements that make them unique.

If their application is successful, they will receive an early offer to Deakin. Students will need to apply directly to Deakin – telling how their skills and experience will set them up for success at University. They will also need to preference the scheme via VTAC.

Courses participating in the Deakin Regional Access Scheme will have a unique VTAC code for those applying for the scheme. **Students must also make a VTAC application.**

Federation **Early Offer Program**

Open to domestic and PR students only.

Requirements: Year 12 pass, meet VCE prerequisites and essential entry requirements, and ATAR required

Secure your place at Federation University in 2025. Finishing high school can be stressful, so why not give yourself peace of mind with Federation University's Early Offer Program? Not only is an early offer exciting to receive but knowing that you have already secured a place in a degree means you can head into exams fully focused.

Aspire Community Contribution Program

Open to domestic and onshore international students

Requirements: Year 12 pass, VCE minimum prerequisite study scores and ATAR required

At La Trobe, we believe there is more to being a good student than marks alone.

The [Community Contribution, Aspire Early Entry Program](#) rewards the skills and knowledge students gain from the positive impact they have made on their school or community through *community service, leadership, or volunteering*.

Successful applicants also receive their **early conditional offer** late September or early October for their chosen course along with minimum ATAR requirements. Many courses have a minimum ATAR of 55.00, but some professional degree programs have higher requirements.

Up to 40 [Aspire scholarships](#), worth \$5,000 per year for up to four years, will be awarded to leading eligible Aspire students.

The [Aspire ATAR Table](#) shows the minimum ATAR for some degree courses for entry through Aspire in 2025. Should an applicant's preferred course not be listed on this table, then the minimum ATAR is 50.00.

Applicants are required to provide information about the length and frequency of their community service and/or volunteering experience.

Types of volunteering include –

- fundraising for charity
- helping to run a school or community club
- coaching a sports team
- volunteering at a nursing home
- mentoring younger students
- leading as a school or house captain

Open to domestic and PR students only

Requirements: Year 12 pass, meet VCE prerequisite study scores, and ATAR required

RMIT's Early Offer Scheme values the entire experience of a student and provides diverse opportunities for students to leverage their acquired skills into their future career and find the right journey to their desired learning outcome.

Australian and Permanent Resident students can apply for one course and must apply at the following RMIT link - [Early Offer Scheme](#). The eligible courses on offer are also found at this link.

The application process requires students to -

1. Choose two of the following categories:
 - Analytical and Critical Thinking
 - Leadership
 - Communication
 - Creative Thinking and Innovation
2. Write a 200-word statement of their experience for each of the two chosen categories.
3. Supply supporting documentation verifying their involvement in the two categories they have written about.

Applications will open later this year. The conditional offer will become unconditional should students complete Year 12, meet the course prerequisites, and attain the Early Offer ATAR required. **Visit [Early Offer Scheme](#).**

Early Entry Program

Open to domestic and PR students only

Requirements: Year 12 pass and no ATAR required for entry into Bachelor or Diploma courses

Year 12 students creatively inclined, they can apply and secure their place at SAE before they even sit final Year 12 exams through the SAE.

Students complete an application form that includes their current school's name and the course they wish to study. Applications are now open.

Early Entry Program

Open to domestic and onshore international students

Requirements: Year 12 pass, meet VCE prerequisite study scores, no ATAR required

A different way to enter university that will not depend on your ATAR.

The [Early Entry Program | Swinburne](#) is a unique opportunity for current Year 12 students to receive a conditional offer based on a recommendation by the school, and not based on an ATAR.

Applications are open, and close later in term 3. Successful students will receive a conditional offer and the offer will become unconditional should students complete Year 12 and must meet the course prerequisites – particularly English (study score of 25) or EAL (study score of 30).

Details of the application process, as well as participating courses can be found below.

1. Application process

Students must organise a recommendation from a school representative – the school’s principal, the year level coordinator, Head of House, or Career Practitioner – in order to proceed with an application.

2. Eligible courses

Courses that will be offered through this program can be found at [Eligible Courses](#), and students can only apply for one course.

3. Recommendation form

Once an application is submitted, students will receive a confirmation email which will include the form they need to forward onto their chosen school representative, who will complete the form and return it to Swinburne, who will match it with the student’s application.

Students must also make a VTAC application.



Early Access to 2025 Courses at the University of Tasmania (UTAS)

Open to domestic and onshore international students

Requirements: Year 12 pass, VCE minimum prerequisite study scores, no ATAR required

UTAS’ *Schools Recommendation Program* is a program allowing Australian year 12 students to apply for up to five courses and receive a conditional offer before the final results are released.

So, rather than an ATAR, the application is based on a student's school recommendation and their Year 11 results. It has been designed to give students confidence in completing their Year 12 and receiving a university place in 2025.

The program is open to nearly all of the UTAS courses, including the new flexible double degrees, undergraduate degrees, and associate degrees, and students can nominate up to five preferences, but only receive one offer.

Courses not participating in the program are –

- Bachelor of Medical Sciences and Doctor of Medicine
- Paramedicine
- Bachelor of Health Science (Medical Radiation Science)

Applications open 27 June 2024, and there are a number of application rounds, and applications can be submitted right up to 4 October 2024.

Note: students who apply by 29 July will be eligible for a main round offer in September. Applicants will be notified of their success after UTAS has received the recommendation from their school.

VU Guaranteed: Victoria University's Early Entry Program

Open to domestic and onshore international students

Requirements: Year 12 pass^^

Guarantee your place at Victoria University (VU) or VU Polytechnic, prior to completing Year 12.

Students can apply for VU Guaranteed (VUG) if you are a Victorian Year 11 or Year 12 student studying VCE, school-assessed (unscored VCE), VCE Major and IB.

Successful VUG applicants can enjoy:

- a guaranteed place at VU or VU Polytechnic
- free access to EdUnlimited practice exams, topic quizzes and study notes
- 5 bonus aggregate ATAR points for most courses that consider an ATAR as part of the admission criteria*
- tailored advice and a personalised course plan once results are released

*Excluding the Bachelor of Education (P-12)

Note^^: Students will still need to satisfy the admission requirements/prerequisites for the courses they preference in VTAC. Students who do not meet the admission requirements, will be guaranteed a place in an alternative course designed to help them achieve their goals. Therefore, the course offer students receive will be based on their course applications/preferences and on study scores + other admission requirements etc.
