TISC Hints and Tips

Navigating TISC for the first time can be daunting, here are some hints and tips to make it easier:

- o Don't know where to start, read our step-by-step guide on how to apply through TISC and visit the TISC Website for more resources.
- Take the time to understand how <u>TISC Preferences</u> work and how to use them to your advantage.
- Prepare your supporting documents for uploading, if required. Confirmation of Year 11 final and Year 12 final results will be provided to TISC automatically, so you will not need to upload them separately, however, if you would like to use your mid-year Year 12 results, you will need to upload these to TISC. Statements of Enrolment for RTO, TAFE and Enabling programs will need to be uploaded to TISC as well as supporting documents for Portfolio Entry.
- Explore all of the Entry Pathways available to you, not just ATAR.

Ngala Kwop Biddi Brighter Futures Scholarship Launched

Murdoch University is proud to launch the 'Ngala Kwop Biddi Brighter Futures Scholarship', which will enable every School in WA to nominate one of their graduating Year 12 students for the \$12,000 award. These scholarships will support incoming students who are raising awareness and motivating others to support three crucial pillars of a cohesive community; **Sustainability**; **Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion**; and **First Nations recognition**.

The Scholarship was officially launched at a function for Secondary School Principals, hosted by the Vice Chancellor Professor Andrew Deeks in the new Boola Katitjin teaching and learning facility on Thursday 15 June.

At the event, Zahra Al Hilaly - a first generation Australian from a Palestinian and Iraqi family, Murdoch Law and Communications graduate, and recent finalist in the youth category of the Western Australian of the Year Awards – reflected on her wonderful experience as a Murdoch University student and the opportunities her studies had afforded her. She spoke about her own journey as a champion for gender equality, youth policy and refugee rights. Zahra added her support to the Scholarship and what it represents.

The scholarships will be available to one Year 12 student from each Secondary School who is making a positive contribution to the world we live in, and who will be commencing their studies the following year. The Scholarship is inclusive of all entry pathways, and applies to all undergraduate courses.

Spotlight on Environment, Conflict and Security.

Exploring the Intersections of Climate Change, Natural Resources and Peace: A Pathway to a Sustainable Future

Are you considering a career in Foreign Affairs, Defence, Journalism, environmental protection/conservation, or Peacebuilding? Are you passionate about understanding and addressing the causes and impact of climate change? Our major in Environment, Conflict and Security could be the perfect degree for you.

In an era defined by increasing levels of geopolitical competition and armed conflict, graduates with expertise and understanding of the interlinkages between the environment and security have become increasingly sought after by International organisations like the UN, the Australian government, private companies, conservation agencies, research institutes and media outlets.

To address this need, Murdoch University has launched a new major on Environment, Conflict and Security. This major is unique in Australia as it provides interdisciplinary insights from the environmental sciences and social sciences. Students delve into topics such as environmental politics and law, armed conflict,

climate-induced migration, environmental diplomacy, peacebuilding, resource conflicts, and sustainable development.

Our students learn from international experts like Dr Tobias Ide, a leading academic with over ten years' experience in research on climate, the environment, peace and conflict. Tobias, who was recently appointed a climate and security advisor for NATO, is frequently consulted by decision makers in government and industry, foreign ministries, the EU, think tanks and NGOs, including being asked to speak United Nations in March 2023 on environment and peacebuilding.
