Hi All

The <u>deregulation of VETis Consulting</u> after the start of the 2019 academic year caused bedlam across many West Australian schools. Between 12,000 and 13,000 VET in Schools students were impacted and VET coordinators across 130 schools are desperately trying to put things right.

I first heard news about VETis Consulting at the Notre Dame CDAA Networking Day on 12th February. By the Future of Youth Employment Conference on the 20th, those who had already been impacted were sharing survival strategies with those who had just got the news.

A senior person from South Metropolitan TAFE was more than helpful, telling people to contact their local TAFE and register their issues. There was no crisis management plan in place at that stage, but she assured people that TAFE WOULD do whatever it could to help.

Shenton College has been quoted as telling parents:

If any Year 12 Shenton College student, as a result of this deregistration, is at risk of not achieving the WACE, the school will apply for special consideration to the School Curriculum and Standards Authority, who will grant WACE if all other conditions are met.

SCASA has not released a statement on this. Special consideration will need to be given by them on a case by case basis.

If you have any survival strategies to share with other VET Coordinators, please let me know so that I can publish them.

What's a Pre-Apprenticeship and where can I find one?

A pre-apprenticeship is entry level training that can provide a pathway into the industry of your choice. Generally, they are offered in the traditional trades industries, such as carpentry, electrical, plumbing and automotive.

The term pre-vocational or pre-traineeship may also be used when talking about entry level training in non-traditional trade industries, such as hospitality, animal care and management.

Pre-apprenticeships can assist in improving literacy and numeracy skills as well as focusing on developing some essential work-related skills. These skills can help you be better prepared for work and be a stand-out job candidate.







VET in Schools – Seeking a Better System

The demise of VETis Consulting has made me think about how clunky the whole VET in Schools machine is.

I have spent time this month trying to find tips to help VET teachers and coordinators



reduce their workloads as they attempt to straddle the Education and the VET silos.

• Practicing VET Coordinator: I wish I had some tips on the improving the workload. Possibly the best way would be if all the RTOs that we auspiced with had the same expectations and the same templates. That's more of a request rather than a tip. The workload is heavy for teachers who are also teaching general subjects and working across DoE and DTWD and all the different requirements make it really hard to get a more streamlined system. In fact each year the requirements are more or at the very least templates have been changed. That was more of a rant!

Former Education Department Regional VET Coordinator

Unfortunately VET has ever increasing "paperwork" requirements. The regulations and controls are very high and people/schools new to VET are not always aware of this. The extra paperwork and all the other requirements (lots) goes with the job and that is why it is so important schools properly resource their VET staff (an ongoing challenge).

There is actually really good support for DoE schools and VET Practitioners. Practitioners (..need to link..) into the existing supports.

The best thing any school VET practitioner can do is to network, network, network, Make sure they have signed up to all relevant online networks, information sources etc.

VET Coordinators and teachers cannot continue to be expected to straddle systems that were never designed to work together. Systemic change needs occur so that VETiS has its own systems and processes that are the core business of a purpose build system.
