

What is in the NCCD?

National Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data of School Students with Disability (NCCD) is a collection of data in August each year. It counts the number of school students receiving adjustments (or support) because of a disability.

This national data collection helps governments and schools plan for the needs of students with disability. The aim of the data collection is to make sure that students with a disability have access to the same quality education as the others in their class.

The date of the annual census collection this year is Friday 7 August 2020.

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Who is included in the NCCD?

National Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability


To include a student in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data of School Students with Disability (NCCD), all schools are required to consider the following key questions:

- Is the student receiving adjustments to assist them with their ability to participate in schooling on the same basis as their peers?
- 2. Does the student meet the NCCD's broad definition of disability?
- 3. Has the school discussed the adjustments (help) with the student and/or parent/carer?
- 4. Does the school have documentation (assessments, medical reports or other paperwork) about the student's functional needs, the adjustments (help) that they provided and how the student progressed over time?



National Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data of School Students with Disability (NCCD) is a collection of data in August each year of the number of school students receiving adjustments – or support - because of a disability.

What are examples of adjustments?

Students need different types of help at school. Some students need a little help sometimes (*minor adjustments*) but other students need a lot of help nearly all the time (extensive adjustments). The type of help and support that a school provides is also very different depending on the needs of the student. The adjustments can include:


- physical changes to the school buildings or grounds (e.g. ramps or special equipment);
- extra teacher support in classes;
