The JackJumpers are now accepting applications to be part of our work experience program, based around our school holiday basketball camps and clinics. Our school holiday programs run all over the state, see dates over the page for more info.

Our work experience program offers students the chance to work alongside our community coaches, to gain practical experience in breaking down drills and tailoring them to different skill sets. Participants will spend most of the day with children but also liaise with parents, as well as Banjo’s our proud community partner. And nothing says working in the JackJumpers community team like carrying boxes and setting up equipment! Our work experience program involves students in all aspects of life in the community team at a professional sports club. Delicious lunch from Banjo’s included!

We are looking for those with an interest in sports and recreation, ideally with some basketball experience, who enjoy spending time with children and aren’t afraid of hard work! Tasks may include:

- work with the JackJumpers community coaches to introduce the skills of basketball to participants
- provide a positive, encouraging, and supportive experience for participants
- assist with all elements of the day, including stocktaking prizes, organising lunches, setting up and cleaning up equipment etc
- bring a sense of humour to working alongside our mascot Jack the Jumper
- have fun with the program!

Our work experience is open to those in grades 10, 11 and 12, as well as those enrolled in higher learning or vocational courses. Anyone over the age of 18 must have a Working with Vulnerable People card to be eligible.

In addition, the JackJumpers offer work experience with our club’s various other departments throughout the year, on an adhoc basis. This may include working with the front office staff (operations, partnerships, media and membership) as well as the basketball department (high performance, team management, physiotherapy). Unfortunately work experience as a player or coach is not available.
