8 ways to manage your money as a first-year uni student

You'll learn many new things during your university years, but several of those lessons will happen outside the classroom. As you grow comfortable living independently, you'll need to figure out how to maintain your lifestyle while planning for the future. <u>Read The Good Universities Guide's</u> eight ways to manage your money as a first-year university student so you can take control of your financial life.

Career road test

It's hard to sort through your ideas and options for study and jobs in your future. When buying a car, most people will shop around, look at different models and do a few test drives before making a decision. You can take the same approach when it comes to making decisions about your career. The Australian Government has developed a workbook that will help you investigate your chosen industry or occupation and then to think about how your research impacts on your career plans. <u>Click here</u> to access the booklet and start planning.

Does a course with a high ATAR guarantee better job prospects?

The Good Universities Guide has found that much of what students know about salaries and employability at graduation is guided by belief, rather than facts and figures. In general, students tend choose courses with the highest entry requirement they can access with their ATAR. In theory, the higher the ATAR, the better the course and the better the employment outcome.

If you're a high-achieving student, you may be considering a course that has a high ATAR minimum threshold score. Perhaps you're re-considering your course options because you may not get the ATAR you had initially hoped for. Regardless, it's important to note that the ATAR minimum threshold for courses are an indication of the popularity of a course – it doesn't necessarily reflect how good your options will be once you graduate.

When looking at graduate outcomes, such as employment rate or a high starting salary, the courses with high ATAR requirements don't necessarily deliver the best outcomes— well, not straight away. <u>Keep reading here.</u>

Vocational Education and Training (VET) qualifications include certificates, diplomas and advanced diplomas, offered across a large number of industries and study areas. They offer many advantages — from pathway options to skill development. If you fit into one of the categories below, find out more about <u>VET</u> <u>courses</u> that could be your next step:

Jobs you may not know about including Radio Journalists, Inspectors and Regulatory Officers, Research and Development Managers

<u>Radio Journalists</u> collect and analyse facts about newsworthy events by interview, investigation and observation and write stories for radio news or current affairs programs. You usually need a bachelor degree in journalism, followed by a one-year cadetship involving on the job training, to work as a Radio Journalist.

<u>Inspectors and Regulatory Officers</u> administer and enforce government and corporate regulations and standards. You usually need a formal qualification and strong attention to detail to work as an Inspector or Regulatory Officer. Vocational Education and Training (VET) and university are both common study pathways.

<u>Research and Development Managers</u> plan, organise, direct, control and coordinate research and development activities within organisations. You usually need a university qualification in a related field and relevant industry experience to work as a Research and Development Manager.

The importance of digital skills

The Australian Industry and Skills Committee's (AISC) National Skills Overview shows the current explosion in new technologies is reinventing the way businesses are run. This has significant implications for the workforce, which needs to evolve and be agile to keep up with this technological expansion. As a result, <u>Digital skills</u> are becoming increasingly important and a priority for many industries. These digital skills include coding and programming, exploring the world of cloud computing and the Internet of Things, and developing and using robotic and automation technologies.

Are you the next Co-op scholar?

Co-op scholars balance strong academic performance with their personal interests, professional development and community involvement throughout their time in the Program. To ensure scholars are prepared for this they look for a solid academic foundation from high school applicants. For a 2021 high school leaver entering the program the minimum academic requirement is an ATAR of 96 (or equivalent), OR entry into the chosen degree program at UNSW, whichever is the higher. 

VET Student Loans is an Australian Government loan program that helps eligible VET students pay their tuition fees. If you're studying a diploma, advanced diploma, graduate certificate or graduate diploma you may be eligible for a VET Student Loan. If you're studying a TAFE higher education degree course, VET Student Loans don't apply. Away from Base - Diploma in Educational Studies, Tertiary Preparation Queensland

Available as part of ACU's Away from Base program, the Diploma in Educational Studies (Tertiary Preparation) allows Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students to live and work in their local community, while studying and attending six on campus residentials, each lasting for a week at ACU's Brisbane Campus. This offering, which is available via direct entry application, is designed for those who want to undertake a pre-service teaching degree in early childhood, primary or secondary education.

Whilst undertaking this diploma, the Indigenous Higher Education Unit (Weemala) will support individuals to access additional resources which may include a study and financial assistance for residential stays, such as travel, accommodation and meal allowances. Pandemic impacts students' employment outcomes

Latest NCVER research shows the pandemic had a wide impact on the employment outcomes for students who had completed a VET qualification in 2019. The VET Student Outcomes 2020 report examines how students who completed a VET qualification in 2019 were impacted by the pandemic in terms of employment outcomes at the end of May 2020. The report, which uses data collected in mid-2020 from the <u>National Student Outcomes Survey</u>, shows 71.6% of domestic qualification completers were employed at the end of May 2020, a decline of 5 percentage points from the previous year. 

What is the ATAR?

QTAC is the body that calculates and provides Year 12 students with their Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR). The ATAR:

- Is the primary mechanism used nationally for tertiary admissions
- Indicates a student's position relative to other students
- Is a 2,000 point scale from 99.95 down to 0.00
- ATARs less than 30.00 are expressed as "30 and below"

QTAC calculated the first Queensland ATARs in December 2020 which brought Queensland in line with the rest of Australia. Thirty students received an ATAR of 99.95 with 16 different subjects including Biology, Chemistry, Economics, Engineering, English, English and Literature Extension, French, German, Italian, Latin, Literature, Mathematical Methods, Modern History, Philosophy and Reasoning, Physics and Specialist Maths. This list of subjects is NOT an indication of subjects that will guarantee a high ATAR. It has been included to show the wide range of subjects that students studied, did very well in and who received an excellent ATAR.

What subjects should you study to gain an excellent ATAR

Year 10 students and their parents often ask this question. The answer is, the subjects that you enjoy, have had past success in and meet any future tertiary course prerequisites. You want to get to the end of Year 12, receive your results and be able to say to yourself that they are the best results you could get while maintaining life balance and wellbeing. The ATAR is a rank used by QTAC or your competitive entry into tertiary institution courses. It is NOT an indication of your 'intelligence' and future success and happiness in life.

Available as a free downloadable eBook, this Guide includes all listed university prerequisites and assumed knowledge needed to meet entry requirements for courses in 2024. If you are finding managing your stress and/or panic difficult, speak with your school guidance officer, school counsellor or make an appointment to see your family doctor. They will all have great ideas to assist you to move forward positively and confidently.

English Language requirements for Nursing at all universities

As a Year 12 student, before you can be considered for a place in a Nursing or Midwifery course, the <u>Australian Nursing and Midwifery Accreditation Council (ANMAC)</u> requires that all applicants demonstrate their English language proficiency via one of the following options:

Option 1: English is your primary language AND you have attended and satisfactorily completed at least six years of primary and secondary education taught and assessed solely in English. At least two years of this education must have been between grades 7 and 12. This education must have been completed in one or more of the following countries: Australia, Canada, New Zealand, Republic of Ireland, South Africa, United Kingdom, United States of America. If this describes you, then you will need to complete a declaration confirming that you meet the requirements as described above.

Option 2: You do not meet the above option then you will need to sit an approved English language proficiency test. If this describes you, then you will need to sit one of the following approved English language proficiency tests and achieve the minimum scores: IELTS Academic, TOEFL iBT, PTE Academic, or OET. Before booking one of these tests, <u>please check to see which tests are accepted by the institution you are applying to</u>.

Subject incentive scheme

Double degree options

A double degree allows you to broaden your education and develop an interdisciplinary field of knowledge in less time than if you were to complete two separate degrees. Completing a double degree means you receive two testamurs (official certificates) – one for each of the degrees you complete when you graduate.
