

JobTrainer Western Australia

JobTrainer Fund

JobTrainer is a training subsidy that makes courses free or low cost. \$506.3 million across Australia over two years from 2021-22.

That's about \$25M/year for WA



Australian **Apprenticeships**Pathways

Apprenticeships and traineeships

Additional \$2.7 billion over four years with the aim of creating more than 170,000 new apprenticeships and traineeships for young people.

This includes significant subsidies to employers who take on an apprentice or trainee.



Superannuation for low income earners

\$31.5 million to expand the superannuation guarantee to include employees **earning less than \$450 per month**, particularly benefitting women.




Digital Skills Cadetship

\$10.7 million over three years to trial up to four industry-led pilots in the Commonwealth public sector.



Curtin Big Day Out for Teachers: Key Takeaways

The short lockdown following the outbreak of Covid in late April resulted in the Curtin Big Day Out for careers teachers going online. These are my key takeaways:

Curtin's Focus: Linking Learning to Industry

Curtin stives to:

- ensure it is teaching key knowledge and skills identified by Australian and international peak industry bodies, and,
- works to get students to do assignments, work experience and work placements within industry.

Micro-credentials

As undergraduates are studying and identifying the knowledge and skills that industry wants,

they can take on <u>"Curtin"</u>

<u>Credentials"</u> in five themes,

Innovation, Leadership, Digital

Mindset, Future of Work, and

Influence & Persuasion.

These units can also be taken by graduates already working in an



industry. Undergraduates get to meet and study with professionals already in industry.

Online Learning

Curtin has won awards for its online course delivery but still has feedback that more personal support is needed. Students who gave a presentation, said that they liked the online lectures as they could go back over the recordings if they wanted to check something. Their online work was complemented by face to face lab work, workshops and tutorials.

EARLY OFFERS - ENROL NOW

You can enrol at any West Australian university for 2022, now. Curtin is doing all applications for degrees and uni enabling courses through TISC. It is free to apply through TISC if you put Curtin as your first preference.

Offers are conditional based on:


- WACE achievement
- ATAR results
- course pre-requisites
- English requirements

Early offers are NOT available for quota courses like medicine.

ALTERNATE PATHWAYS

There are now many ways to get into university. ATAR provides a great pathway and underpinning knowledge but the pandemic has increased the number of pathways to university.

It used to be that 26% of students got to uni through the ATAR pathway. Competition for students has seen the range of alternative pathways to uni grow. It is easy to anticipate a significant growth in the percentage of secondary students without ATAR who go to uni by following alternative pathways.



Curtin College

If you don't get meet the entry requirements for the course you want to do, check out the range of options <u>at Curtin College</u> which is situated at the south end of the Curtin Bentley campus.


They offer a Diploma in 6 areas and successful completion of them will give you access to second year of your degree.

There are three entry points to the diplomas per year.

A full diploma at Curtin College will cost \$16,000.

Portfolio Entry

Alternate entry for selected courses is available for those who can demonstrate equivalence to Curtin's ATAR entry by submitting a portfolio showing evidence of their academic achievements, qualifications and ability.



TIPS:

Norma Jeffrey gave this presentation and seemed a bit frustrated by the quality of applications that were received. (I found a paper she has written called How to MakeSure Your Uni Portfolio Stands Out to Assessors.)

Only 51% of applicants were accepted via portfolio entry for 2020 and for 2021.

Applicants need to spend more time on their applications.

- First, choose a course!
- Start preparing your resume now and build it up throughout the year in a way that enhances your reputation as someone who would be successful in that course.

- Get letters of support from people who can attest to your ability to do well at uni.
 Your sport coach who has supervised you training little kids would be better than your Aunty.
- Sell yourself in your covering letter. This is your pitch; it is NOT your life story. Draft it now and refine it throughout the year.
- Include your academic results for Year 11 and 12.
- Apply through TISC and put in the TISC code for your chosen course.
- Get it in on time!!

UniReady

If you don't meet Curtin's minimum admission criteria, the UniReady Enabling Program can help you qualify for entry into a range of undergraduate courses.

UniReady Graduates usually do really well when they are doing their degree.



- Cost: free
- **Duration**: 17 weeks (includes orientation, tuition-free and exam weeks)
- **Study mode**: On-campus, online or a combination of both
- **Intake:** semester 1, semester 2
- Location: Perth campus, Pilbara Universities Centre*, and Kalgoorlie campus*

*Course enrolment is online, with additional face to face and online support offered via the Pilbara University Centre and the Curtin Kalgoorlie campus.

Students learn how to do referencing, do academic writing, they tour the library, learn how to use Blackboard and other online tools. They also learn more about uni courses and often change their course choice.

Students who undertake the <u>UniReady</u> program generally do very well when they start their degrees.

Access Curtin

<u>Access programs</u> are for those who are unable to meet Curtin admission criteria through other pathways,


An <u>Access Curtin</u> place grants admission to a range of courses at Curtin that require an ATAR of 70.

If you're eligible for this pathway, you will be granted entry to Curtin in 2022 on the condition that **you pass two of your first four units of study**. After that, your place at Curtin becomes unconditional.

SCHOLARSHIPS

There are merit and needs based scholarships awarded by Curtin. Applicants can only get one Curtin scholarship. If you win more than one you will be awarded the most generous one.

- Get your documents ready now:
 - Resumes
 - o References
 - Centrelink documents if needed.
 - o Bank statements if needed.



The <u>John Curtin Scholarship</u> goes to students in the top 5% of school graduates.

<u>Curtin Excellence Scholarships</u> are automatically awarded to students who achieved an ATAR of 96% or above.

Maths Methods and Chemistry and 80+ ATAR are highly valued by Curtin Science and Engineering. Students who take alternative pathways struggle to master the concepts.

If you DON'T have maths methods, a multidisciplinary science is the best pathway. You can choose your specialty at the end of your first year.

Curtin will work with applicants to <u>design an alternative pathway</u> that is best suited to them.

Scaling of Maths Methods and Chemistry in ATAR results means that students aren't disadvantaged when they apply for science and engineering places.

Notre Dame Early Offers Process

Notre Dame's Early Offer Program is open to Year 12 students who have demonstrated academic excellence and/or are making a significant contribution to their school or community.

The school recommendation is read 3 times:

- First cut.
- Before the interview
- Before the final recommendation is made.

At the interview Notre Dame wants to know:

- 1. Why the applicant wants to go to Notre Dame.
- 2. Why the applicant wants to do the course they have chosen (at Notre Dame.)
- 3. What contribution the applicant makes to the community. (Notre Dame Early Offers go to applicants who want to make the world a better place.)

Physiotherapy and Law degrees applicants needed to have a predicted ATAR of over 93.

A school-based traineeship is an introduction to a potential career in the public sector.



They work towards their Certificate II in Government (Public Administration) which counts towards their Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE).








Higher Wages
