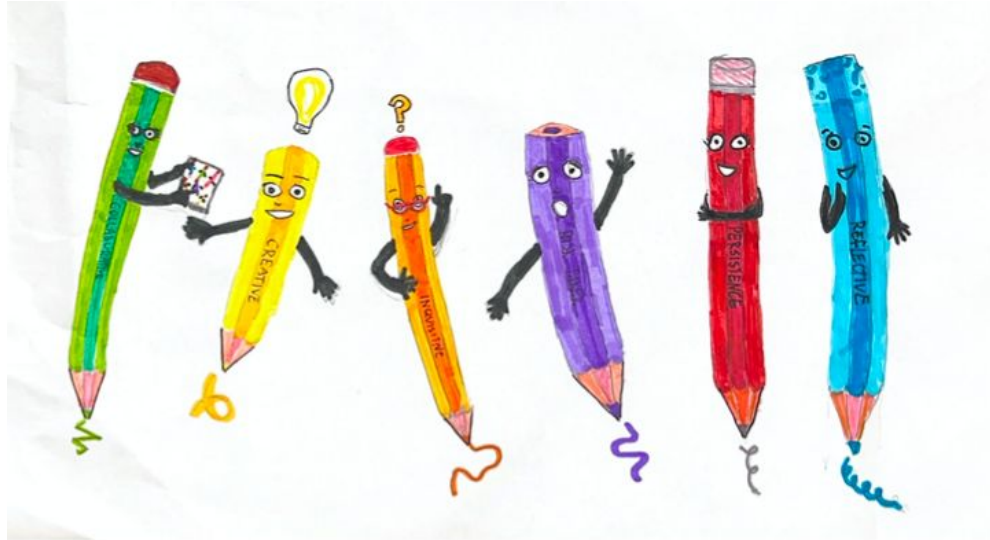
Everyone has the right to be safe and protected from unsafe behaviours.

Holy Name Primary School has a responsibility to create a comfortable, caring school environment where students are respected, their voices are heard and they feel safe.

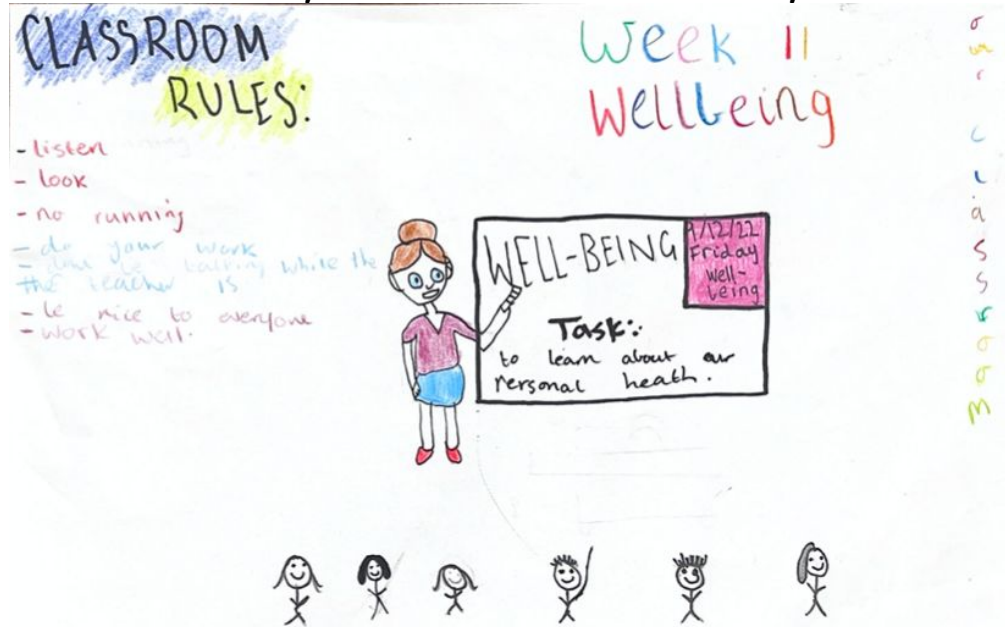
Our Dispositions remind us of all we are capable of achieving and how with a Growth Mindset we can thrive and grow.

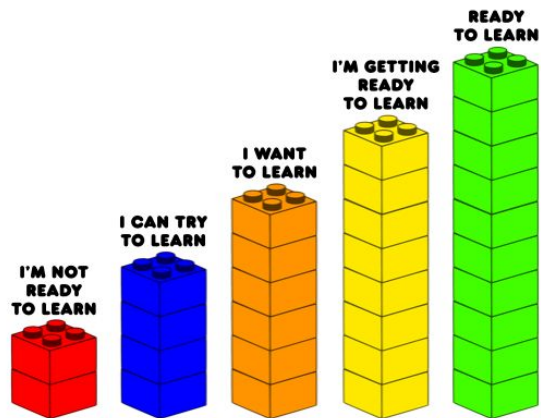
Student Participation

Reporting and Responding

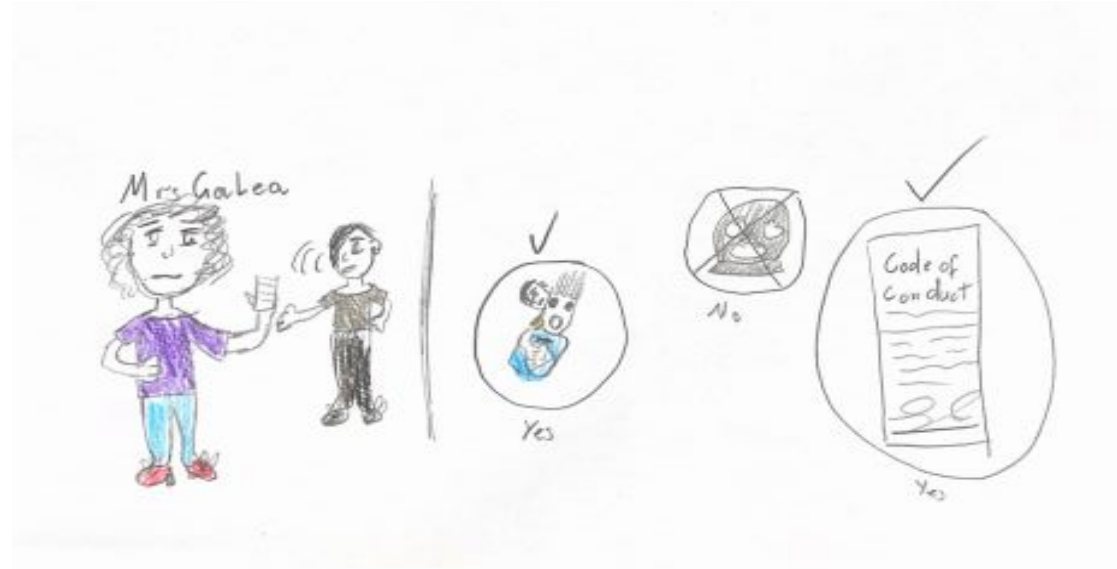
Our school respects children's views and their privacy. If a child has a concern and reports this to a staff member they will take the appropriate action. All staff have access to a Child Safe Folder that has all of the policies and guidance on how to respond. Mrs Cecala is our Child Protection Officer. You can speak to her or another staff member. Mrs Cecala also provides advice to staff on Child Safety.

New Staff

Before anyone can work or help in our school, background checks are made to see if the person is suitable.

Before Mrs Galea decides if the person is that the right person to be in our school she must check three things.

- ❖ Check if they have a working with children
- ❖ Check if there is a criminal record
- ❖ Have signed a Code of Conduct
