

LWAYS CROSS AT THE CROSSING

2. Always cross at the crossing

3. Children should be with an adult Up to about the age of 10 or 11. Younger children should always hold hands with an adult when crossing roads.


THINK

4. While out walking - help your child make decisions about where to walk, where to cross and when to cross. Talk about the meaning of different road signs.





Make it a rule for everyone to always put on their seatbelts before driving off.

Have children use the 'safety' or kerb side door when getting in and out of the car.


It's safest for children to continue using their booster seat until they achieve a good seatbelt fit which is around 145cm tall.





## School drop off zones

Take care when dropping your child off at school or picking them up. Park only where it is allowed and use the school crossing. Think about parking a little way from school or in a side street.




