



#### Counselling and support

Amber Community provides free of charge counselling, information and peer support programs to more than 3,000 Victorians impacted by road trauma every year.

Counselling is provided to anyone impacted by transport trauma irrespective of when the collision occurred. Clients include bereaved families, friends and colleagues; injured people and their carers; drivers and passengers; witnesses and emergency service workers.

### Education

Amber Community is committed to educating and raising community awareness about road safety and how road trauma impacts lives. A vital part of this educational work is sharing the 'lived experience' of road incidents and finding the 'why' behind the need for change. We work with community groups, schools, workplaces, and risky drivers on our roads and design programs to meet these diverse groups' needs. We believe that no one should have to experience road trauma. Our unique road safety programs reach thousands of people each year to have road safety at the core of every business and community – and shift community norms to embrace a safe system.

Programs delivered also work with grief, loss, trauma, and well-being strategies for staff exposed to road trauma, such as emergency services and communities affected by road incidents, including debriefing.

Regional coordinators collaborate with local communities to provide flexible programs and activities to address local road issues, and all programs are delivered locally by local people.

It is also an opportunity to pay tribute to those agencies and individuals who work tirelessly to reduce road trauma.
