

How much can I earn before my family's benefits are impacted?



If your family is on a disability pension, or some other government benefit, you can still earn quite a bit before your income impacts on the family's benefits.

The calculation depends on variables like how many kids are in the family, but it seems as if school students can earn \$150 a fortnight before their income starts to impact on a family's benefits.

<u>CarersWA</u> has a <u>Young Careers Peer Support Groop Toolkit</u> and other support for carers ages 8 – 25.



The <u>Special Tertiary Admission Test</u> is available as an alternative entry pathway.

All students must complete Year 12 with an ATAR or gain entry via the <u>STAT</u> pathway if not sitting the ATAR.

The Test is managed by ACER.

- ACER do not impose any restrictions on who can sit STAT.
- Universities/course authorities may impose
 restrictions on who they will accept STAT results
 from. Candidates should check with the institution
 to which they are applying to determine if their
 STAT results will be accepted.



NEWS FROM CAREER EDUCATORS' EVENTS

All universities in Western Australia hold special events early in the year for career educators.

The COVID Cloud Silver Lining.

There is widespread recognition that young people are being impacted by COVID and other global worries like climate change and now the war in Ukraine.

Dr Chad Morrison from Murdoch pointed out that the full impacts of these threats on students will not be known for some time.

In anticipation of the negative impacts of these shocks all universities are actively seeking to deliver a more student centric approach.

Universities are creating new meeting places,

wellness centres, study support programs, mentor programs, induction programs and there has been a return to more face to face on campus events.



Notre Dame

In February career advisors started the 2022 professional learning with the Notre Dame Career Connect conference which In Focus Careers featured in the March Supplement. Notre Dame wins awards for its student centric approach but even they were keen to talk about their new wellness initiatives and student support programs.

Other universities were all keen to promote their student support and well-being programs. These will be available to students before they enrol at university through course support and career advice, and they will be thick on the ground once students start at a university.

Students are strongly encouraged to do Maths Methods at school and to achieve 75+ ATAR.

Bachelor of Multidisciplinary Science - New in 2023

Students with an ATAR of 70 will get you into this course, with the specified prerequisites.

Bachelor of Advanced Science 95+ ATAR

This is the course for students with a 95+ ATAR. They only take 40 students into this course per year.



1000 new accommodation places at Curtin

It doesn't matter if you are from South East Asia or South Perth, Curtin wants you to stay in their oncampus accommodation.

In 2022 the new accommodation is subsidised 50% so some rooms are only \$80/week. Substantial subsidies will continue in 2023, although they are unlikely to be as generous as in this inaugural year.

The rooms are nice but haven't changed much in 20 years, but the pastoral care and support is outstanding.




Residents get help through tutoring, with scholarship applications, connections to industry leaders, closer engagement with Curtin academics and networking with experts from other universities.

Applying for Medicine at Curtin

At Curtin University, the entrance process for getting into Medicine includes:

- doing better than most in the <u>University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT ANZ)</u>.

If you get short listed based on those results, you then need to go through a:

Multiple Mini Interview (MMI) process.

Rural Entry Separate Application



Students eligible to apply for rural entry also <u>need to lodge a separate application</u>, in addition to their TISC application. Students eligible for the rural pathway may be students in rural schools, metropolitan schools, or boarders.

Online Information Sessions

Rural Academic Lead from Curtin Medical School, A/Prof Keith McNaught, and his colleague, Ms Priya Krishnan, have been hosting online sessions for school-based career professionals. They focussed primarily on the rural entry pathway.

The one-hour sessions cover the full process for application and address all the common questions related to entry to Medicine. The PD session includes a walk through all the resources available to schools and students. Primary School Resources

Deirdre Hughes is perhaps THE world leading primary school career specialist.

I did her *Career-Related Learning in Primary Schools* webinar in late February where I heard about the <u>Our Future Derby</u> initiative designed for low SES primary school students. Only 58% of students could name more than 10 jobs at the start of the project.

Through the project, Derby primary school subjects were linked to the world of work so that an enhanced context was introduced to their learning.

The key learning I gained was breaking was that Career Related Learning in primary schools breaks equity barriers that the kids had.

Some of the strategies she used were:

- Nominating Career Related Learning Champions within the school.
- > Zoom coffee and Cake sessions were held to explain the initiative to parents.
- Engage with local employers who volunteer to be career ambassadors.
- ➤ Using the Skills Builder Framework

Year 9 Career Education Lesson

Brett Neasham from Governor Stirling shared this on LinkedIn.

Working with a group of year 9 students today, I asked them what they thought about the idea that they could be working in a role or industry that doesn't yet exist. That led to a discussion of the emergence of <u>dark supermarkets</u>.

The implications of these could be profound - in their lifetime, supermarkets as we know them today may well cease to exist, and their children may never set foot in one.

- Dark supermarkets could see the removal of an entire suite of customer service roles, frequently filled by students and others who have not benefitted from study or the acquisition of a trade. These types of disruptors should form a key part of the conversation around career development and planning (there is so much to unpack here).
- Coles is exploring the concept of drone deliveries. Milkrun is building a network of small retail delivery hubs with a promise of delivery in 10 minutes. Woolworths is investing in building a warehouse operated by robots.

Students can study these in:

- HASS (the economics of change, creation of new industries, the intersection of technological advancement and the low skill level industries),
- STEAM subjects (the design of delivery systems, the digitech that underpins them, implications for environmental management),

- Arts-media (marketing of new concepts, opportunities for delivery of arts-media in rapidly evolving commercial spaces, the aesthetics and functionality of delivery packaging).

Career discussions and embedding disruptors into the curriculum is a vital part of engaging students in a conversation about change, with a focus on one fundamental concept - how are you going to position yourself to benefit from these emerging technologies and the societal changes they bring with them?

Research

Dr Chad Morrison Murdoch University Presentation: Teachers Vital Role in Delivering Stability

At the Murdoch University Master Class, Dr Chad Morrison talked about the disruptive impact of COVID, climate change and now the war in Ukraine on students.

He talked about the vital role teachers are playing in providing stability to students.

There are great examples of world class, contemporary, research driven leadership in West Australian schools.

He said that experienced teachers are retiring or leaving teaching, and new teachers are being snapped up which is exacerbating the disadvantage of students in hard to staff schools.

There is an urgent need for outstanding high school graduates to go into teaching so that all students receive outstanding school education.

- We don't yet know the impact of the past 2 years on students.
- Students are going to school less and engaging differently.
- Low SES students were less ready to learn online (Sonnemann & Goss, 2020, p7)
- Greater impact of social shocks on households, particularly now SES households with insecure incomes.

NCVER The Best of Both Worlds? Integrating VET and Higher Education

I watched this webinar by Steven Hodge and Elizabeth Knight who had done in depth research of models of integrated VET and higher education to identify the sustainability of different models.






Webinar: The best of both worlds? Integrating VET and higher education

They spent a lot of time and effort to discover that integrated arrangements are difficult and expensive to develop and often difficult to sustain.

These models may be more widespread and sustainable, however, if providers are supported with the expertise and resources to undertake mapping processes, where providers and their staff in the two sectors trust and value each other, where employers value both VET and HE, and students find demands associated with integrated offerings acceptable.

They identified these barriers to sustainable models:




I asked the presenters if any of the models had developed frameworks for collaboration prior to beginning the operational tasks involved in trying to develop integrated models.

Apparently NOT.

The VET people continue to see the uni language as impenetrable



The uni people are intractable about flexibility. Without having a higher, student centric goal that all parties agree to work towards, it is difficult to foresee integrated models surging into the education environment any time soon.



VET as a re-engagement pathway for early school leavers

VET is an important pathway for educational re-engagement for early school leavers.

About 63% of Longitudinal Survey of Australian Youth (LSAY) respondents who left school without completing Year 12 had re-engaged with education via some form of VET by the age of 25.

Apprenticeships and traineeships made up around 51% of all educational re-engagement, followed by other VET courses (certificates and diplomas, 34%).

Parents' plans for their child the year after the child had left school were shown to influence educational re-engagement through VET, with those whose parents wanted them to go on to VET more likely to




follow that pathway. For the early school leavers whose parents' plans for them did not include VET, those who had undertaken some VET subjects at school at the age of 15 were more likely to re-engage with education through VET than those who had not. Find the report <u>HERE</u>.

Solution to Digital Skills Shortage

All Australian industries need people with technical skills. The health and agriculture and education sectors all need people with digital skills.

There is already a critical digital skills shortage in Australia's technology sector.

It currently employs 861,000 Australians which is 3 times as many people as the mining sector.



The Digital Skills Organisation has been working on this strategy to encourage people to get digital skills.
