ENGLISH

The English domain is organised into three dimensions: Reading, Writing, Speaking and listening. The learning in these areas or dimensions is interrelated. For example, speaking and listening contributes to the development of students' reading responses. Writing contributes to communication about texts read or viewed and to reflection and learning. To help support student progress in all three dimensions, learning contexts are diverse and include situations that are informal, formal, planned and spontaneous.

During term two we will be focusing on analysing information reports, text comprehension through literacy circles and exploring persuasive writing, relating back to our inquiry focus on sustainability. Later this term, the students will be involved in classroom debating.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

This term the students will be involved in learning about a range of topics, themes and Catholic church events including:

- Easter
- Creation and the responsibility they have
- Pentecost
- Feast of the Sacred Heart
- Mission What is their mission as a Christian in 2024?

In the final 2 weeks of the Term, the students will begin talking about the Mini Mission Fete and how they would like to contribute to make a difference to a charity.

They will also begin the process of exploring Confirmation. They will continue to learn about Confirmation during Term 3.

The Year Six students will have the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday 10th August at 1pm.

MATHEMATICS

During Term Two we will be focusing on multiplication and division, fractions, data representation, length, perimeter and area.

In Year 6 we have a large focus on fractions and decimals. We will focus on finding equivalent fractions, simplifying fractions, adding, subtracting and multiplying and dividing fractions and decimals and making connections between equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages. We encourage students to approach these topics with a positive attitude and provide lots of opportunities to work with concrete materials to help consolidate their understandings.

Students knowing their multiplication tables helps considerably with many concepts in fractions so we encourage working on these at home as much as possible.

INTEGRATED STUDIES - INQUIRY MODEL

This term students will be immersed in a sustainability unit focussing on worldwide agricultural methods, and their impact on the country's environment and economy. Students will also explore the various geographical and environmental factors that play a part in farming and agriculture, including floods, drought, etc.

They will take part in an investigation about a country of their choice and then compare information with other students' research about a different country and its agriculture. In Week 4, we will head off to Edendale Farm to participate in activities relating to sustainable farming practices.
