Free Dental or \$99

1. Medicare (CDBS):

- Provides access to basic dental services for children for FREE
- Benefit entitlement is capped at \$1,092 per child every two calendar years.
- Many families may be eligible, making dental work completely free of charge for them.

2. Private Health Insurance (PHI):

- Families may be able to claim their visit through their PHI if they have dental extras coverage.
- Eligibility depends on the specific coverage within the family's insurance plan.

3. \$99 Deal:

- Provides a Full Check-Up and Clean for \$99.
- X-rays or Fluoride treatment, if required, are covered under the deal.
- Treatment prices for any further issues (e.g., Decay) are approximately 30% less than the average private dentist.



1. Introduction

School-based dental services (SIS), delivered via mobile dental vans or fixed dental clinics near schools, have traditionally been the model of delivery or public dental case for children in Australia. However, community needs, expectations, and government policy directives have changed over time and have led to a different model of dental service delivery for children, and they vary between Australian state and territory jurisdictions. SIS have been the comerstone of many government-funded dental programs internationally, targeting unmet oral health needs among children, and its workforce has primarily consisted of dental therapists [12].

Some Australian states like Victoria and New South Wales have ceased SDS and integrated child and adult dental services within centralised community health services (3).

Although many countries have limited dental therapists to practice only in government-finded dental programs [1,2], event regulatory changes to their scope of practice standard have enabled independent practice in Australia [4], and they are permitted to work in both the public and private sectors. In went times, there has been a renewed emphasis on giving user choice through consumer-directed case for publicly funded dental services [5] i.e., users of Australian public dental care should be given more flexibility in seeking and receiving services from a dental provider of their choice.
