Resources that are <u>free</u> but will require a subscription:




Pevan and Sarah

How to create a subscription

- I. Locate the URL: https://pevanandsarah.com
- 2. Click on "Cub Club" located halfway across the top of the active page
- 3. Scroll down and click "Join Now"
- 4. Click on "Subscribe Now" under the heading "7 Day Free Trial"
- 5. Enter your details to receive access to the site for 7 days. Follow instructions of any activation email you might receive. It is \$7.99 a month after this time if you wish to continue (there is no obligation to).
- 6. Save your details for easy access to the site.
- 7. Enjoy exploring the videos... especially the 'Alphabet Jam' and 'Get Your Finger Out' videos which your child will be able to sing along to.


<u>Alphablocks</u>


