Committing to a co-ordinator role means attending Fair Committee meetings and bringing together the volunteers – it doesn't mean doing everything yourself.

### Roles we have filled

#### Fair Co-ordinator | Andrea T

Chairs the Fair Committee and owns the budget.

## External Stalls and Entertainment Co-ordinator | Cat A

Co-ordinates entertainment (including booking rides and other attractions), working alongside the Class Stalls and Main Stage Co-ordinators. Ensures compliance with Food Safety regulations including council permits.

## Class Stalls Co-ordinator | Elena F, Mollie M, Sue K

Co-ordinates with all the individual class stalls to make sure they know what they need to do, and plan out bulk purchases / power requirements.

#### Student Stalls Co-ordinator | Sue K and Mollie M

Co-ordinates with all the individual students wishing to set up their own mini stalls, making sure they know what they need to do.

# Main Stage Co-ordinator | Marie M

Co-ordinates the bands / main stage on day.

### Advertising / Marketing Co-ordinator | Ally M

Design, distribution of flyers and advertising and updating content for social media and newsletter / Dojo.

### **Logistics Co-ordinator**

Co-ordinates billboard advertising, power requirements, marquees and the setup and pack-up on the day.

# **Sustainability Co-ordinator**

Promotes sustainability through hands-on educational activities and co-ordinates prizes/awareness.

## **Sponsorship Co-ordinator**

Co-ordinates Major Sponsors, Silent Auction and the Raffle.

#### **Class Art Co-ordinator**

Co-ordinates with all the individual Class Parent Representatives to collate a piece of artwork from each class to raffle off at the Fair.

# Class Stalls

We ask every class to run a stall at the Fair. It's a great way to get everyone involved, and it also means we don't have to hire as many external vendors. Over the years, we've evolved a good balance of food, market and entertainment-based stalls and we have a pretty good idea of what works well. That means we have a target list of stalls we hope to run each Fair year. Some are more work than others, so we do our best to work with each class to find a balance and ensure there are plenty of helpers on each. We generally ask the Class Parent Rep to help get things started by contacting all the parents in their class and asking for volunteers to work on the stall. Our stalls include:
