Finally, we ask you to commit to growing in faith – to take the opportunity to learn and develop a mature understanding of our faith.

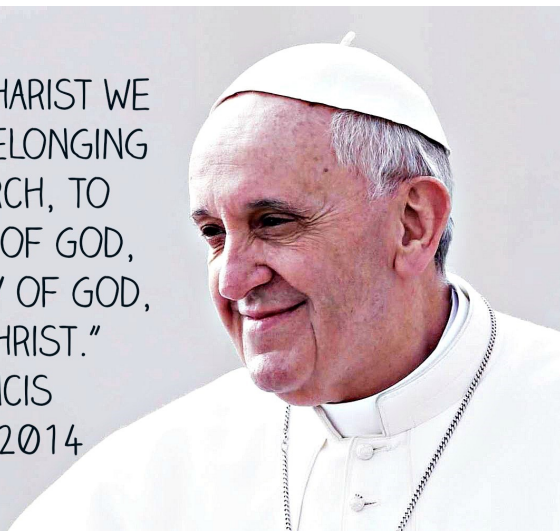
