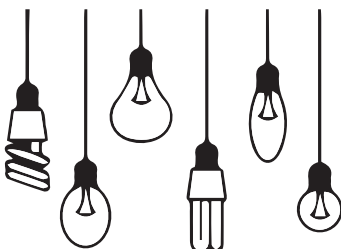
Share your highs and lows of the day, or respond to the following questions:

Lent

VIOLET (or Purple) is the colour of royalty, repentance, and self-discipline and is the traditional colour for the season of Lent. This deep rich colour represents a time of penitence and prayer.

Creative Response

Begin your home devotional times this week by saying "**Jesus, you are the light of the world.**" As you do, light the Christ Candle.

Then have household members take turns lighting their candles from the Christ Candle. As each one does, say together: "**You are a child of the light. Make your light shine before others.**"
