



24thSunday in ordinary time—Year B—15thSeptember 2024



Mark 8:27-35 recounts a significant moment in the ministry of Jesus, where He challenges His disciples to recognise His true identity and the cost of discipleship. It reveals the deep, transformative nature of Christ's love and the call to embrace it in our own lives. At the heart of this passage is the question of identity and sacrifice, both of which are intimately tied to love. When Jesus asks, "who do you say I am?" Peter's response—"you are the Christ"—is a recognition of who Jesus is, but it also points to the depth of God's love in sending His Son. Jesus, as the Messiah, embodies love in its purest form: sacrificial and redemptive. Yet Peter's understanding of what this love entails is incomplete, as he resists the idea of Jesus suffering. His instinct is to reject pain and suffering, which is a natural human response. However, Jesus reframes love, showing that true love involves sacrifice. The call to take up our cross and follow Christ is a call to love deeply, even when it costs us. Love, in the Christian sense, is not always comfortable or easy. It often requires us to let go of selfish desires, to embrace humility, and to be willing to suffer for the good of others. Just as Christ's love led Him to the cross, our love for others—rooted in God's love-may sometimes involve personal sacrifice. At its core, this passage invites us to reflect on how we live out love in our daily lives. Are we willing to love others even when it's hard or inconvenient? Do we follow Jesus' example of self-giving love, or do we avoid the cross in our relationships and commitments? The cross is not just a symbol of suffering; it is also a symbol of the immense love that Jesus has for us, a love that redeems and transforms. When we take up our cross, we participate in that love, trusting that even in moments of difficulty, God's love will sustain us and lead us to new life. In this way we are reminded that love is not passive but active and bold. It calls us to be vulnerable, to give of ourselves, and to trust in the power of God's love.



First Holy Communion **This weekend,** we joyfully welcome the children from our schools and the catechist programs as they receive their First Holy Communion. This is a momentous step in their faith journey, and we invite you to keep them in your prayers. May their hearts be filled with the love and presence of Christ as they continue to grow in their faith

Lord, we lift up these children to You. May Your love fill their hearts and guide their steps. Help them grow in faith, always aware of Your presence and Love in their lives. May this sacrament draw them closer to You and to one another. **Amen**

First Reading: Isaiah 50:5-9

The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed. My vindicator is here at hand. Does anyone start proceedings against me? Then let us go to court together. Who thinks he has a case against me? Let him approach me. The Lord is coming to my help, who dare condemn me?

Second Reading: James 2:14-18

Take the case, my brothers, of someone who has never done a single good act but claims that he has faith. Will that faith save him? If one of the brothers or one of the sisters is in need of clothes and has not enough food to live on, and one of you says to them, 'I wish you well; keep yourself warm and eat plenty,' without giving them these bare necessities of life, then what good is that? Faith is like that: if good works do not go with it, it is quite dead. This is the way to talk to people of that kind: 'You say you have faith and I have good deeds; I will prove to you that I have faith by showing you my good deeds – now you prove to me that you have faith without any good deeds to show.'

Gospel: Mark 8:27-35

Jesus and his disciples left for the villages round Caesarea Philippi. On the way he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say I am?' And they told him. 'John the Baptist,' they said, 'others Elijah; others again, one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he asked, 'who do you say I am?' Peter spoke up and said to him, 'You are the Christ.' And he gave them strict orders not to tell anyone about him. And he began to teach them that the Son of Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again; and he said all this quite openly. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. But, turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said to him, 'Get behind me, Satan! Because the way you think is not God's way but man's.' He called the people and his disciples to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine. let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.'
