- Days 2 4: Homeland
 - $\circ~$ Meet the Traditional Owners and have a yarn around the campfire
 - $\circ~$ Spend a day on country looking for bush tucker and visiting significant sites
 - $\circ~$ Explore the homeland as you collect and make your own bush medicine
 - $\circ~$ Visit the local school called Kenmore Park where the Traditional Owners teach
 - $\circ~$ Learn to cook kangaroo tail using traditional methods over fire
- Day 5: Kings Canyon (Watarrka)
 - o Enjoy the spectacular 'Rim Walk' at Watarrka National Park
- Day 6: Uluru and the Field of Lights
 - $\circ~$ After dark, travel to the Field of Light Uluru.
- Day 7: Kata Tjuta and Return Home
 - $\circ~$ Make the most of your final morning and enjoy a sunrise over Uluru and Kata Tjuta.
