What are we learning in Term Three?

Literacy	Numeracy	Investigations and Inquiry
This term we will look at two text types: Information Reports and Narrative Performances.	Patterns to Help Solve Problems In this unit students will explore patterns and sequences. They will focus on recognizing and continuing skip counting, colour, shape and object patterns. They will apply this under-	This term in Inquiry we are starting our 'Light and Sound' unit. Year One students will consider sources of light and how to create shadows. They will build instruments and use different materials to experiment with sounds. Each student will work towards a group project of creating a production of a story using puppets and sound effects.
Students will consider the features of these text types and their purpose. In Reading, students will focus on merging their prior knowledge with new information they can obtain through reading non fiction texts. They will also practice answering questions by searching for and using information and making predictions about what will hap- pen in a text. In Writing, students will explore the writing process through creating their own Information Reports about their	standing to real life problems and situations.

1-5	Information Reports	Ask your child to say some facts about a chosen topic. Remember facts are things that are true. They are not made up or based on our opinion. For example: Dogs have four legs (is a fact), Dogs are cute (is an opinion)	
7-11	Narrative Performances	Practice reading with your child like they are talking. Try focusing on reading at an appropriate pace and using expression that matches the characters in the story.

1-7	Patterns to help solve problems	Practice skip counting by 2s, 5s and 10s. How high can you count to? Draw colour or shape patterns on a piece of paper. Make patterns with beads or other objects in your house.
