By 2050 there will be as much plastic in the world's oceans as there are fish.

Plastic production continues to increase globally, and shows very little sign of slowing down.

Research from the University of Newcastle shows humans are consuming, on average, 5 grams of microplastic a week – equivalent to a credit card's worth of plastic.
