


What is VTAC?

Preparing for interviews, auditions and folios

Lots of courses have requirements for selection like presenting a folio, doing an audition or attending an interview. Getting ready to present your work can be nerve-racking, so here are some tips.

academic achievement (e.g. ÅTAR or tertiary grades), a large numb of courses want to assess applicants' other attributes.

Folio presentations and auditions are common for courses in the creative arts, like acting, dance, music and design.

Interviews are often part of the application process for courses in the health sector, such as medicine, natural therapies, and social work—areas where you'll be working with people day to day. Some TAFE institutes and smaller colleges require all applicants to

attend an interview, regardless of what they're applying for.

To find out whether you need to do an interview, folio, audition or anything else as part of your course application, read the "essential requirements and admission criteria" in the course entry. VTAC

cloent administer intensievs auditions or folio presentations—you will need to arrange these with the institutions directly. The following tips for how to make the best possible impression have been provided by staff from institutions who regularly audition, intensieva and/or evaluate the folios of applicants.

Read the brief

The first and most important thing is to make sure you understand what is required if an author calls for a five minute monotogue, don't prepare a fifteen minute discree piece. Do your homework

Research the institution and course beforeland solyculcan talk confidently about they you want to study there Showing that you know about the course structure and expectations will demonstration you interest. It is also perfectly fine to ask the institution for advice on preparing—they can tell you what to expect on the day and anything in particular they will be looking for. And if you have any friends who have already been through the process, make sure to ask them for tips.

Plan ahead

You might not know every question that will be asked, but you can guess some of the obvious ones. Likely suspects include "why do you want to study here?" and "why are you applying for this course?". Practice answering questions like these so that on the day you can answer with ease. Think about what makes the curse or institution unique so you can tailor your answers. If you had to submit a VTAC Personal Statement or a written submission as earl of your

application, be prepared for questions about these by reading then again before the interview.

Be professional

Doing an interview or presenting a folio is not much different from a job interview. You need to dress neatity, look and sound enthusiastic, make eye contact, and don't forget to turn off your phone! This is your chance to impress and stand out from the crowd. Be confident, dress accordingly, come prepared and ask questions.

Be passionate

Let your enthusiasm for the subject shine through. Interviewers want to know that you are enthusiastic about he industry. Have opinions and ideas about the field you are applying for. For an art or design course, it's fine to talk about what you do and don't like, but the important thing is to be able to explain why. Be selective


When putting together a folio or preparing for an audition, go forquality over quartly. Don't include evenything out-over done. Choose key pieces that dismonstrate your creativity and abilities flyou have to include voic that in only your area of strength in order to meet the brief, don't forget that other applicants are in the same boat. Interviewers are looking for potentials, not perfection. Remember that every applicant demonstrates a different level of skill across search of the orders are being assessed.

Have a back-up

Things don't always go according to plan, so have a back up ready in case of emergency. For example, have a backing track ready in case your accompanist is unable to attend at the last minute. Byou leave your sheet music at home, have another piece ready that you know so well that you don't require the score.






The ATAR profile



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

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

Applying for courses

- List up to eight courses/institutions
- Preference order always list courses in the order you want to get into them
- To add course preferences: Select institution and/or course or type in the course code.
- To move a course on the preference list use the up/down buttons.
- To delete a course use the x button.





Change of Preference C.O.P



- After applying, you can change your course preferences free-of-charge as many times as you like while Change of Preference is open
- The first deadline is for the December offer round (VIC & QLD only), at 4pm on Saturday 14 December 2019
 (Note: IB students will not receive offers in this round so no need to change preferences unless you wish to do so.)
- There is another window if you change your mind between Wednesday 18 December 4pm until Friday 20 December 4pm - C.O.P closed until 9.am 2 January
- IB Results released 9am Thursday 2 January 2020
 - Change of Preferences will remain open from 2 January until 4pm on Saturday 4 January 2019.
- January Offer Rounds start 15 January
- Supplementary Offers start 10 February





Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS)

- SEAS is the special consideration program used by most institutions
- Filling out a single SEAS application will cover all of your eligible preferences
- Primarily for students who have suffered long-term disadvantage
 - Except: Category 1 (Personal Information and Location) everyone should apply
- SEAS allows selection officers at institutions to grant special consideration for course entry to applicants.

- SEAS does not exempt you from completing essential requirements and compulsory admission criteria.
 - You must study course prerequisites, attend all interviews, sit any required tests, and submit all required folios and forms.
- SEAS is not a guaranteed entry scheme or reserved quota, but may allow you to gain entry to a course with a lower ATAR than otherwise



SEAS categories

Category 1: Personal information and location

- As simple as ticking a box
- All applicants should apply for this category

Category 2: Disadvantaged financial background

Category 3: Disability or medical condition

Category 4: Difficult circumstances



Scholarships


- VTAC collects scholarship applications for many institutions

 - Including scholarships which require direct applications to institutions




