LITERACY


(Reading/Writing)



This term, the students will be learning how to recognise and craft different types of sentences. We've been exploring the building blocks of clear and confident writing, starting with identifying the difference between statements and questions. Students will also be learning how to spot sentence fragments and turn them into complete thoughts. To add variety and depth to their writing, students will begin to create compound sentences using conjunctions like *and*, *but*, *because*, *so*, and *or*. We will also be working on expanding sentences by adding details that answer questions like *who*, *what*, *when*, *where*, *how*, and *why*. These expansions not only build better sentences but also help students become more thoughtful and descriptive writers.

MATHEMATICS

Throughout this term, three key mathematical topics will be explored. The first topic we will explore is addition and subtraction, where the students will learn that quantities can be combined and separated to form new quantities within 20. We will then move on to counting and place value, where the



students will be using the base ten numeration system to record, represent and order numbers up to 120. Finally, we will be learning about measurement, ordering length, mass and capacity. The students will use a variety of different concrete materials to help them to explore these concepts. They will also be given the opportunity to put these new concepts into practice by engaging in problem solving sessions.

**KNOWLEDGE
BASED/
INQUIRY**



This term, our students are setting out on an exciting journey to explore both our modern world and the roots of ancient civilisations. We'll start close to home by building our map skills. Students will learn how to read different types of maps, then "travel" across the seven continents and four oceans. Our *Continents, Countries, and Maps* unit brings to life the rich variety of people, wildlife, and landscapes found across the globe. From there, we'll head back in time to ancient Mesopotamia—the land between the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers. Students will discover how this early civilisation shifted from hunting and gathering to farming, leading to the growth of towns and cities. As life became more complex, new roles emerged—builders, merchants, scribes, and leaders—marking the rise of one of the world's first urban societies. Through five engaging chapters, students will explore the development of writing, the creation of laws like those of King Hammurabi, and the spiritual beliefs of the Mesopotamian people. They'll gain insight into how writing, government, religion, and trade helped shape one of history's earliest civilisations.


