ENTRY PROCESS

Entry Process:

Entries are to be completed via Swim Central.

Entries may close early at the discretion of Swimming Victoria.

Entries Open | Friday 19th June 2026 5:00pm

Entries Close | Monday 20th July 2026 11:59pm

Relay Entries Close | Tuesday 21st July 2026 11:59pm

Late entries will be accepted via Swim Central until 11:59pm Tuesday 21st July at \$50 per entry. Strictly no entries will be accepted after this time.

Individual Event | \$23 **Relay Event** | \$48

Individual Event - Interstate | \$48

Conditions of Entry for Visiting Competitors at Metro Championships:

- Visiting competitors are not eligible to score championship points.
- For Long Course (LC) Championships, a maximum of one (1) visiting competitor is permitted per final for an 8 lane pool, and a maximum of two (2) visiting competitor is permitted per final for a 10 lane pool.
- For Short Course (SC) Championships, all events are timed finals with no effect or changes on lanes in finals.
- Points will be awarded to the highest-placed Victorian swimmers, with up to eight (8) or ten (10) (depending on the number of lanes in the competition pool). Victorian competitors receive points, regardless of the number of Victorians in each final.
- Top three (3) Victorians will medal in each event.

VISITOR ELIGIBILITY

Eligibility:

The following interstate metro areas are eligible to compete in the Victorian Metro Championships as a visitor:

- **South Australia:** City North, City Central, City South
- **Queensland:** Swimming Brisbane, Metro Swimming Gold Coast, Metro Wide Bay
- **New South Wales:** Metro North East, Metro North West, Metro South East, Metro South West
- **Western Australia:** All Clubs excluding the following: Albany, Australind, Broome, Bunbury, Busselton, Carnarvon, Collie, Corrigin, Exmouth, Geographe Bay, Gingin, Harvey, Hedland, Kalgoorlie, Kambalda, Karratha, Mandurah, Manjimup Marlin, Margaret River, Mt Barker, Northam, Onslow Occys, Paraburdoo, Peel Aquatic, Tom Price, Wickham, York

PARA-SWIMMER ENTRY PROCESS

Para-Swimmer Entries:

Para-Swimmer entries are to be processed via Swim Central. There is a qualifying criteria for Para-Swimmers, these can be found on the website.

All Para-Swimmers must hold a national classification and be listed on the Swimming Australia National Classification Masterlist. A Provisional Classification is not recognised at any Swimming Victoria competitions unless otherwise specified.

Para-Swimmer Support persons must nominate via Swim Central to the MC Carer position.

Quiet Room is available to all swimmers located in the indoor diving pool. More information is available on the Visual Story Board.

Para-swimmers who have entered the same stroke and distance in both an able-bodied event and a multi-class event must nominate which event they would like to accumulate points in, be eligible for medals in, and attempt to qualify for a final in.

If a nomination is not provided, we will default to allocating points to their multi-class event unless advised otherwise. Please read the process below.

RELAY ENTRY PROCESS

Relay Entries:

Relay entries are to be completed and paid via Swim Central

GUIDE | How to enter and pay for a club relay team

Please Note:

Relay teams must be submitted with an entry time that meets the qualifying time. Clubs will be fined if qualifying times are not reached.

Clubs are able to enter multiple teams in each event, however, only the top 2 teams from each club is eligible to score points.

Relay Change Forms are available from the Meet Supervisor/Technical Director Desk located on pool deck.

Relay Change Forms must be submitted to the Technical Director at least one hour prior to the starting time of the session in which the event is to be swum **ONLY** if there has been a change to the online entry.

Relay team members need to swim in the order listed on the team sheet, if found swum in the wrong order, the team will be disqualified.

Mixed relays must include x2 Men and x2 Women swimmers, excluding the mixed para/able bodied relays.

PARA/ABLE BODIED RELAY

Para/Able Bodied Relay – Staggered Start:

The Para–Able Bodied Relay has been introduced to provide our para swimmers with the opportunity to participate in relays alongside their teammates.

A staggered start is used to create a fair and inclusive event for everyone involved.

ACCREDITATION

Pool Deck Accreditation is required **for all** Coaches, Team Managers, and Para Carer Support. Athlete Accreditation is required for this competition and is automatically allocated.

Nominations are taken through Swim Central and all valid WWCC must be displayed through your profile. All accreditation holders must have a membership with a club to be eligible for the role. Entry will not be permitted if a position nomination has not been made.

Applications Close | Monday 20th July 2026 11:59pm

Late accreditation applications will be accepted via Swim Central at a cost of \$20 per accreditation.

Collection will be upon entry to the spectator grandstands or at the SV offices (Level 2 at MSAC) on Friday 31st July between 11am - 3pm.

EVENT INFORMATION

Backstroke Events:

Backstroke Ledges will be used at this competition as stated in the Backstroke Ledge Guidelines.

It is the responsibility of the clubs allocated to the volunteer roster to install and remove the ledges.

Withdrawals:

Completed withdrawal forms can only be lodged with the Technical Director, these will be made available during competition.

Please fill out the Online Withdrawal JotForm for withdrawals prior to competition day.

Marshalling Procedures & Information:

Assisted Self Marshalling will be used for this competition.

Refunds:

Refunds will only be considered under the following circumstances:

1. Injury or Illness

A valid medical certificate must be provided.

Refund Request Process:

All refund requests must be submitted via the Online Refund Request JotForm.

Refunds must be submitted no later than 2 days after the final day of competition.

Swimming Victoria reserves the right to decline refund requests that do not meet the above criteria.

Swimming Victoria do not allow event changes or swaps once entries have been submitted.

RULES AND RESULTS

Results:

Results will be posted behind the spectator grandstand following the conclusion of each event. Results will be available via Meet Mobile throughout the competition. Please note these are **NOT** official results.

Swimming Victoria will be using Meet Manager to calculate the MC results.

Official results will be made available in Swim Central on the next SV office business day.
