RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Term Three will see many of our Year Six students making their Confirmation where they will become adults within the church community. Students will explore the Sacrament of Confirmation in great depth, linking it into their everyday lives and learning more about the traditions of the Sacraments within the Catholic Faith. Students will explore Scripture within

'The Arts', studying how paintings tell a story and creating their own version of scripture and religious paintings.











ENGLISH

In English we will be exploring three main components, Reading and Viewing, Writing and Speaking and Listening. Within these components the students will also work to improve their spelling and grammar.

In Term Three, our focus is on:

Reading & Viewing

The expectation is that students should be reading every night.

It is still important to listen to your child read as often as you can, asking them questions and making connections to the world around them. An emphasis will be placed on comprehension this term. Encouraging students to read a variety of texts and watch the news is crucial to their reading development. It will also assist them with their transition into Secondary School. We will also have a strong emphasis on language features of various texts and how the author uses language to influence an audience.

Writing

In Term 3 we will be creating: Explanations, Descriptions, Persuasive texts and Procedures. We will be using the Writer's Process of Planning, Drafting, Revising, Editing and Publishing, as well as, exploring the format and language features of each text type. Students will be given the chance to publish their work and present these pieces in a variety of ways. Writing this term will be heavily linked to our STEAM unit of The Arts - It's Showtime!

Speaking & Listening

Students will be involved in a range of public speaking opportunities in class, at assemblies and during excursions and incursions. Students will focus on their listen skills during class and small group discussions with a focus on clarifying content and challenging others' ideas. Students will also work in team environments to create pieces of texts that will be presented to the class. Emphasis will be placed on eye contact, body language and voice projection while presenting.









MATHEMATICS

Students will explore various mathematical concepts throughout the year, which include: Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry and Statistics and Probability. They will use hands on materials, as well as different forms of technology to help solve their problems. Students will also explore various open-ended activities, which aim to improve their mathematical thinking and problem solving abilities, which they can then relate to their own real-world experiences.

In Term Three, our units will include:

Number and Algebra:

Fractions and Decimals, Money (calculating percentage discounts)

Measurement and Geometry:

Area and Perimeter, Converting measurement

Statistics and Probability:

Chance



Term 3 The Arts - It's Showtime!

Students will be entertained, challenged and provoked to respond to questions and assumptions about individual and community identity, taking into account different histories and cultures, while using The Arts to express themselves.

This term students will be exploring The Arts to enable them to develop their creative and expressive capacities. Students will learn about the different practices, disciplines and traditions that have shaped the expression of culture locally, nationally and globally. Students will become both artist and audience in the Arts. They will make, respond and learn to appreciate the specific ways



this occurs in music, drama, media and dance.



This term students will have the opportunity to visit Circus Oz in Collingwood providing the backbone for our STEAM unit - It's Showtime! Students will work collaboratively to design, create and perform a 'Year Six Circus', using the skills and knowledge collected throughout the unit and also on their excursion.

Through our S.T.E.A.M. Unit, students will participate in many hands-on learning tasks that will focus on the skill, knowledge and understanding in Science, Technology, Arts, Engineering and Mathematics to collaboratively plan, design, create and build a 'Futuristic Town'. This town will be open for inspection on a certain date, so please keep your eyes peeled!







PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING (PSEL)



Goal Setting

This term students will continue to set goals throughout the term and monitor their progress. Students will be encouraged to choose goals that challenge them, as well as, enabling them to grow as a learner. These goals will be reflected on and will also provide the basis of their weekly goal setting.





Teamwork

Year 6 will have a strong focus on teamwork and cooperating in groups. Students will focus on making fair contributions, challenging themselves as learners and making responsible decisions when choosing their team mates. Teamwork is an essential skill that will assist in preparing students for Year 7 and beyond.

Transition

This term will have a strong emphasis on organisation and getting ready to transition into Secondary School. Students will complete different PSEL learning tasks aiming to provide them with skills and concepts needed to assist in their transition. Some skills that will be worked on will be: Making Friends, Organising themselves, Problem Solving and Planning Ahead. It is vital that you begin talking with your child at home about their transition, assisting them and answering questions that they may have.











THINGS TO REMEMBER...

- Arrive at school by 8.50 a.m. so your child starts the school day with the whole class and avoids missing out on important information
- Provide a note explaining your child's absences to the teacher upon return
- Hats to be worn in Terms One and Four during recess, lunch and any outdoor activities
- Lunch Orders are on Wednesday and Fridays (orders completed online OR collected from school)
- Students need to bring a drink bottle containing water each day, so they can drink throughout the day
- If there are any medical issues or other concerns, please make the school and/or class teacher aware of these as soon as possible.

UNIFORMS

All students should be in their full school summer uniform in Terms 1 and 4 and must have a hat. Their full winter uniform must be worn in Terms 2 and 3.

Students are expected to be in full school uniform each day. This includes black leather footwear (no logos or labels) and a Galilee hat to use during recess and Sport lessons in Term One and Term Four. On Sport and PE days students are expected to wear their full sports uniform, including suitable runners.
