VET COURSES AT CERTIFICATE II LEVEL GENERALLY ATTRACT STAGE 1 CREDITS



WHILST VET COURSES AT CERTIFICATE III LEVEL GENERALLY ATTRACT STAGE 2 CREDITS

VET Pathways at Endeavour

- Requires an initial discussion with the Pathways Coordinator to determine suitability
- the completion of a written expression of interest application
- strongly encourages work experience the student's preferred industry to promote suitability and understanding of chosen industry
- considers a student's ability to manage a flexible timetable
- may incur additional course costs through consumables and other miscellaneous items.

VET - Flexible Industry Pathways (FIPs)

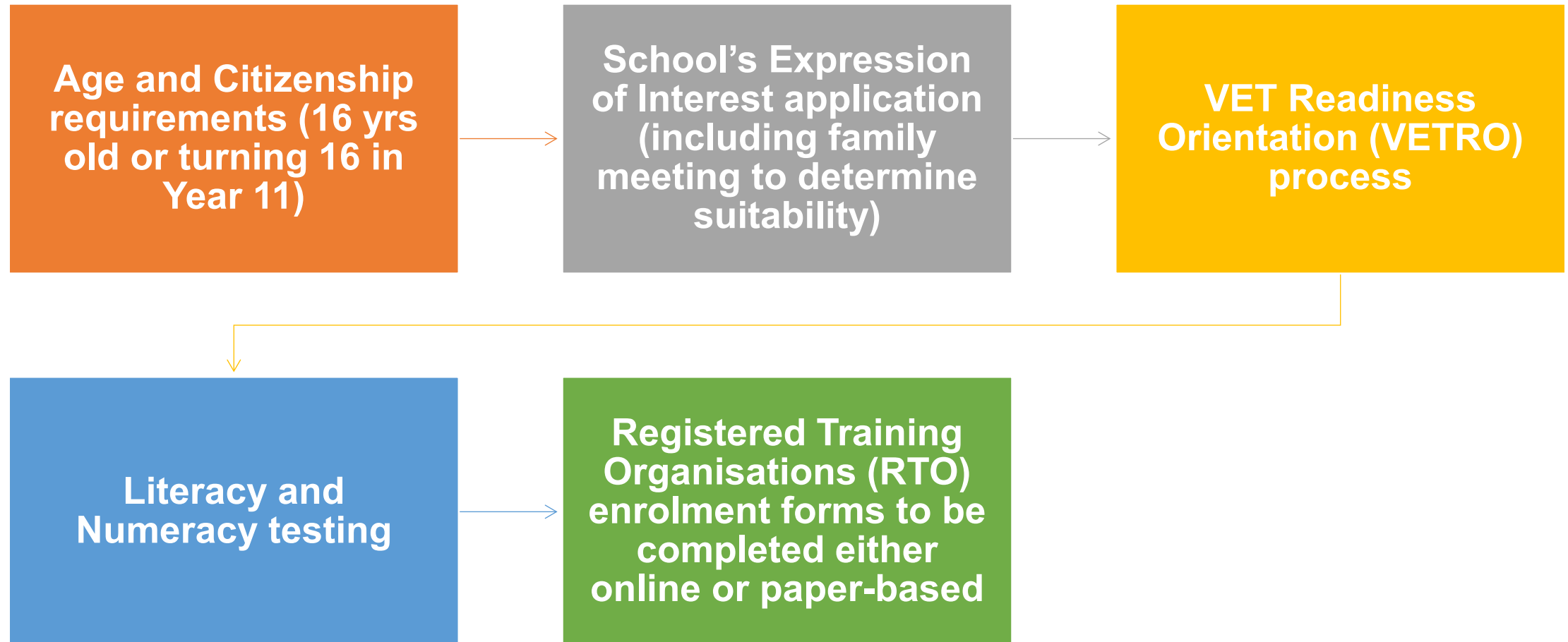
A range of **subsidized** vocational **Industry Pathways** can be commenced at school including areas such as:

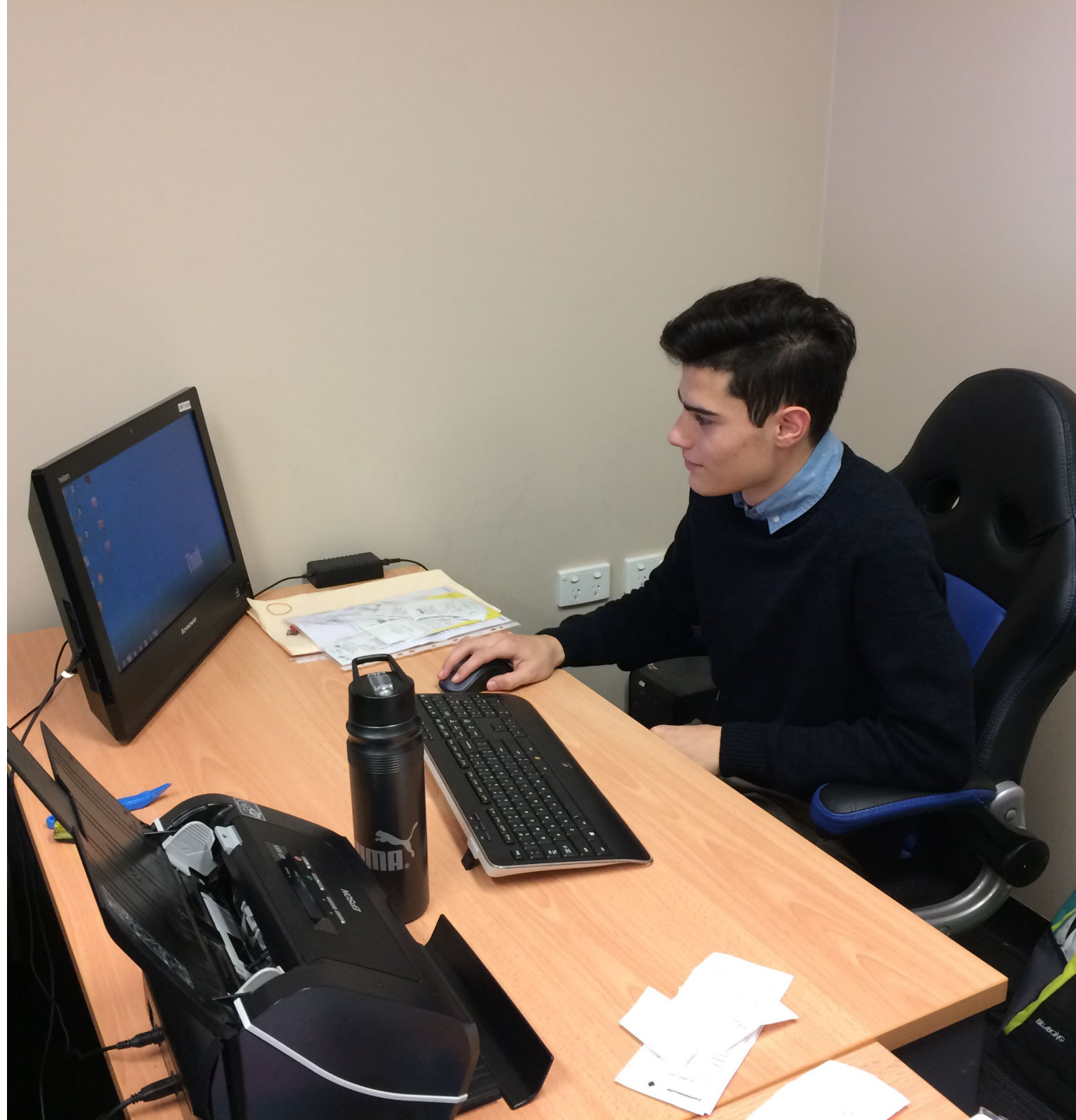


Eligibility Criteria and process for FIPs

General Interest VET Courses

- Short Courses may be undertaken by all senior students from Years 10 – 12 interested in finding out more about a career pathway or obtaining skills to gain part-time employment
- Introductory courses are offered as an entry point into the VET Pathways Program or may be undertaken to determine industry suitability
- Participants will receive a Certificate or Statement on completion and the Stage 1 or 2 credits acknowledged on their SACE certificate
- ***The cost of these courses is the responsibility of the student/ parent and is to be paid prior to enrolment in the program.***



School-based Apprenticeships and Traineeships

- A School Based Apprenticeship or Traineeship (SBAT) gives students an opportunity to undertake a combination of SACE, trade qualification training and paid work whilst completing Year 11 and/or 12
- Student negotiates an employer
- College will support the organisation of the SBAT and ensure 1285 form completion
- Minimum three days per week at school and completion of at least three Year 12 Subjects
- Transition to full-time apprenticeship at the completion of Year 12

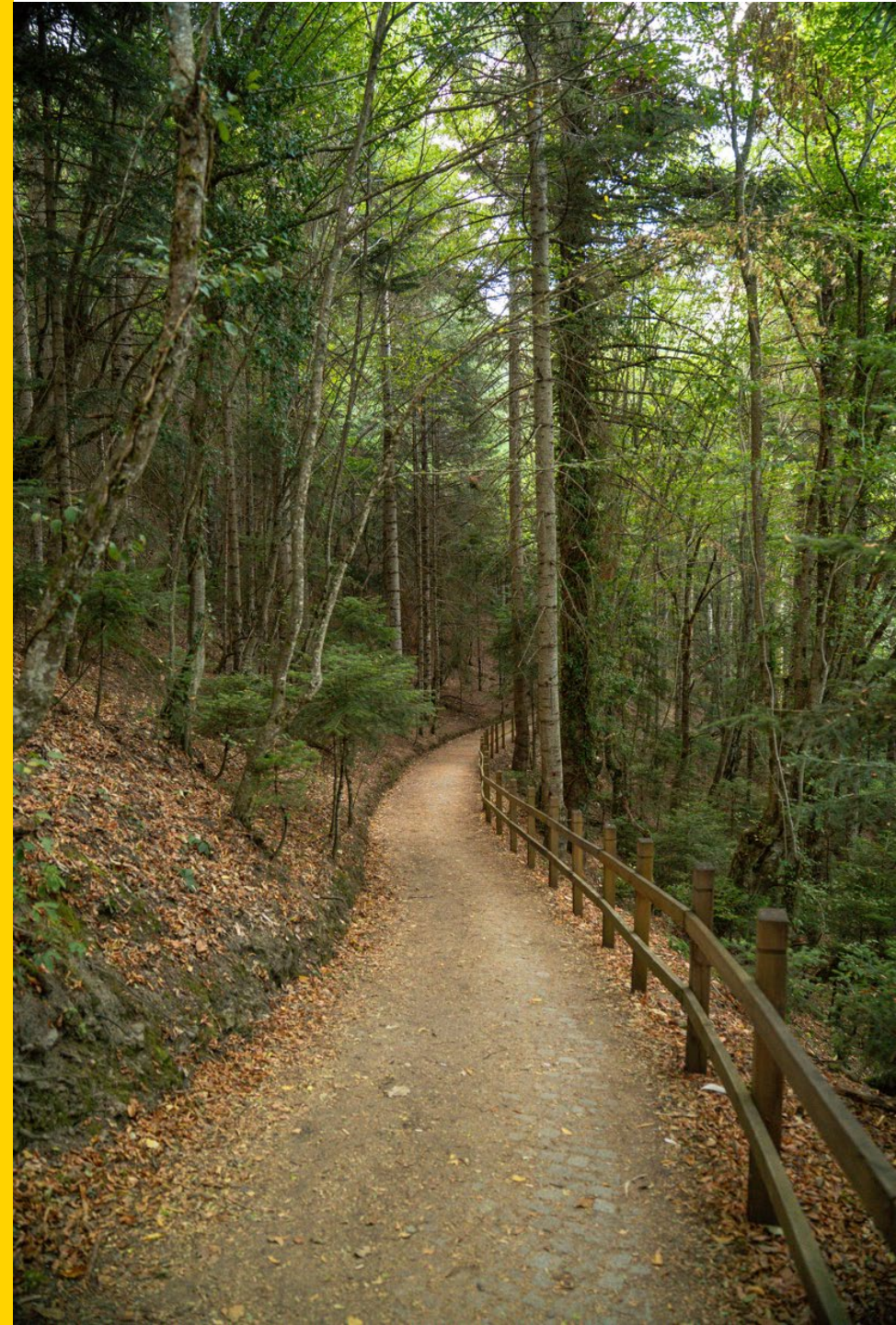




What is Flinders Aligned?

Connected Learning. Clear Pathways.

Flinders Aligned is a co-designed pathway program developed between schools and Flinders University. It recognises SACE Stage 2 subjects and Vocational Education and Training (VET) as strong preparation for university study and provides clear, aligned pathways into selected Flinders degrees.



How it Works?

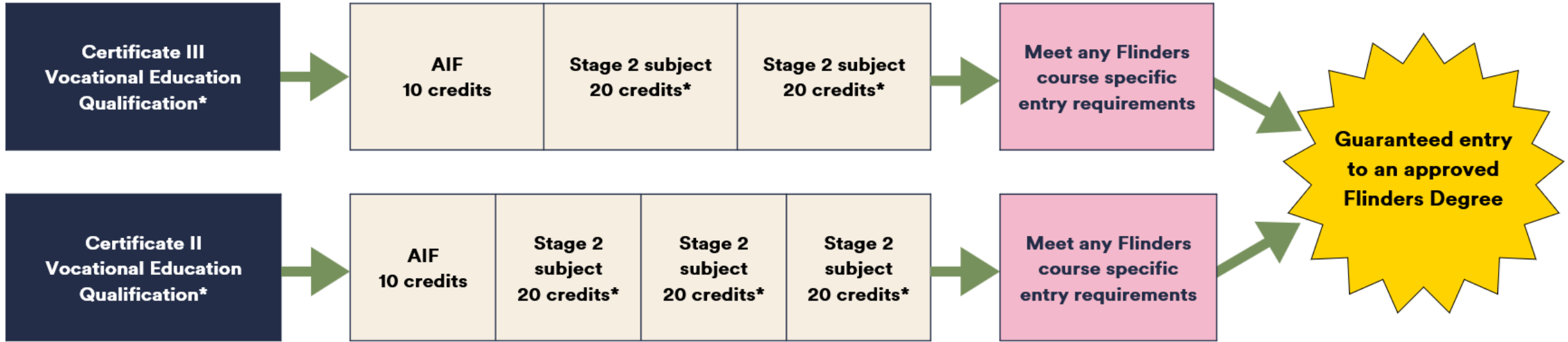
Students must

- Complete SACE through an approved combination of:
 - Selected SACE Stage 2 subjects (inc AIF), and
 - an approved VET qualification

(aligned with the knowledge and skills required for selected Flinders degrees).
- Meet any Flinders course-specific entry requirements (e.g. portfolio, audition, etc).

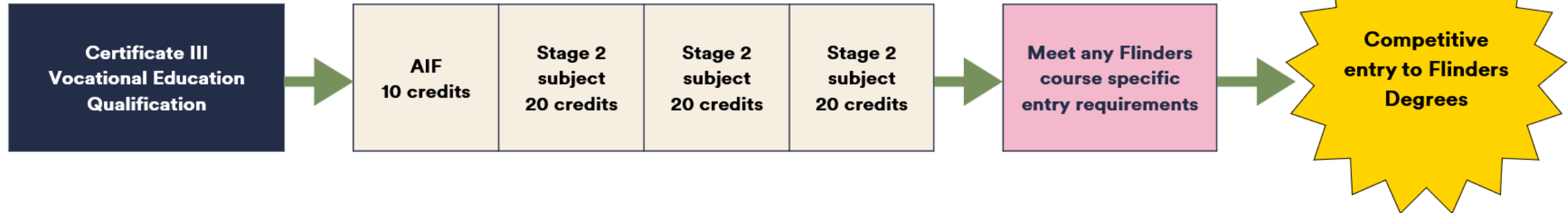


Aligned Pathways

Students must still:

- Apply through the SATAC (for most courses) at satac.edu.au,
OR
- Apply Direct through Flinders for Sport Diplomas and Flinders Online courses via flinders.edu.au/study/apply
- Meet any course-specific entry requirements
(e.g. subject pre-requisites, audition, portfolio, etc)

Key dates:

- Applications open early August
- Apply by 30th September to avoid late fees.
