Liturgical Jottings

Anointing of the Sick 1 One of the seven sacraments of the Church is the Anointing of the Sick. The revised rite from the reforms of Second Vatican Council was promulgated by Pope Paul VI in 1972 titled: "The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick". The final English edition was prepared by ICEL, approved and published in Australia in December 1982 as the "Pastoral Care of the Sick, Rites of Anointing and Viaticum". The Ritual contains eight chapters providing various liturgies and rites for the sick, namely: Visits to the Sick Visits to a sick child Communion of the Sick Anointing of the Sick Celebration of Viaticum Commendation of the Dying

Prayers for the Dead

Rites for Exceptional Circumstances

And an appendix with the Rite for Reconciliation of Individuals.

Looking at the Readings

We hear "Great Crowds" were accompanying Jesus to Jerusalem. It was a great opportunity to challenge them with the demands of believing and following him. These demands come at a great personal cost. Here is a popular quote from Dietrich Bonhoeffer we may ponder on this Sunday:

"Costly grace is the treasure hidden in the field; for the sake of it a man will gladly go and sell all that he has. It is the pearl of great price to buy which the merchant will sell all his goods. It is the kingly rule of Christ, for whose sake a man will pluck out the eye, which causes him to stumble, it is the call of Jesus Christ at which the disciple leaves his nets and follows Him.

"Costly grace is the Gospel, which must be sought again and again, the gift, which must be asked for, the door at which a man must knock.

"Such grace is costly because it calls us to follow, and it is grace because it calls us to follow Jesus Christ. It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is grace because it gives a man the only true life. It is costly because it condemns sin and grace because it justifies the sinner. Above all, it is costly because it costs God the life of His Son: "ye were bought at a price," and what has cost God much cannot be cheap for us. Above all, it is grace because God did not reckon His Son too dear a price to pay for our life, but deliver Him up for us. Costly grace is the Incarnation of God." D Bonhoeffer, Le prix de la grâce, 1985 Traditions chrétiennes 20.

Paul's Letter to Philomen

The second reading is the letter from Paul to Philomen in Colossae. It is the shortest of Paul's writings, a personal note rather than a letter, only 25 verses, written while Paul is in captivity in Rome. The purpose was to solve a legal dilemma of a runaway slave but maintaining a Christian response by pleading freedom for the slave.

Prayer of the Earth (part 2)

Fill us with peace, so that we may live as brothers and sisters, harming no one. O God of the poor, help us to rescue the abandoned and forgotten of this earth, so precious in your eyes.

Bring healing to our lives, that we may protect the world and not prey on it, that we may sow beauty, not pollution and destruction.

A SEASON OF CREATION

The season of Spring has sprung into our lives as we bring a Season of Creation into our experiences. Last Thursday September 1st was international Wattle Day. Wattle is out in abundance and presently reminding us of the golden nature of our environment. Wattle as a plant does bring a way of celebrating creation, giving us renewal in a season of change and life budding anew. This important season goes from Thursday September 1st through to Tuesday October 4th (feast day of St Francis of Assisi patron of creation).



Pope Francis' seven year old encyclical 'Laudato Si': Care for our Common Home is the blueprint document of our inhabiting our natural world. The health and wellbeing of families, communities, depends so much on the environment in where they exist. The environment is more than changing weather patterns, we in our faith are called to consider our relationship with 'mother earth', others and our faith community.

In 'Laudato Si', Pope Francis says the urgent challenge in protecting our common home is a need to bring the whole human family together in seeking a sustainable and integral development, in knowing our natural world changes and where we find ourselves through this. Pope Francis goes further by saying....'all creation is a kind of universal family and everything - the earth, its flora and fauna, and humanity are interconnected.' Taking this further from the beginning till now, the entire creation, as we know it, has been groaning in one great act of giving birth - Romans 8:22

Here at St. Mel's we are an 'Earth Care Parish". This is something we are credited for as we take an ecological view through our faith community in living out the hopes of Pope Francis and Laudato Si. My hope through this Season of Creation are about us taking moments of 'hearing the silent voices' of creation and where our thoughts are taken up ..."Cry of the earth and a cry of the poor'.

POPE FRANCIS MESSAGE FOR WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR CREATION

(an excerpt)

The sweet song of creation invites us to practice an "ecological spirituality" from Laudato Si., attentive to God's presence in the natural world. To base our spirituality on the "loving awareness that we are not disconnected from the rest of creatures, but joined in a splendid universal communion. For followers of Christ, this luminous experience reinforces our awareness that "all things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being" (John 1:3). In this season of creation, we pray once more in the great cathedral of creation, and revel in the "grandiose cosmic choir" made up of countless creatures, all singing the praises of God. Let us join with St Francis of Assisi in singing: "Praise be to you, my Lord, for all your creatures" (refer to canticle of Brother Sun, Sister Moon). Let us join with the psalmist in singing, "Let everything that breathes praise the Lord!" (Psalm 150: 6).

2022 NATIONAL CATHOLIC EDUCATION CONFERENCE

This year the conference is taking the theme of "The Future is Listening". It is anticipated some 1,300 delegates, including educators, religious, priests, parents, and scademics, will gather for the first time in six years. First Reading

A reading from the book of Exodus

The Lord relented and did not send the evil he had threatened.

The Lord spoke to Moses, 'Go down now, because your people whom you brought out of Egypt have apostatised. They have been quick to leave the way I marked out for them; they have made themselves a calf of molten metal and have worshipped it and offered it sacrifice. Mercy, however, was shown me, because until I became a believer I had been acting in ignorance; and the grace of our Lord filled me with faith and with the love that is in Christ Jesus. Here is a saying that you can rely on and nobody should doubt: that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. I myself am the greatest of them; and if mercy has been shown to me, it is because Jesus Christ meant to make me the greatest evidence of his inexhaustible patience for all the other people who would later have to trust in him to come to eternal life. To the eternal King, the undying, invisible and only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.
