



School response to reported incidents of racism

Dear parents and guardians,

At Lowanna College we value the diversity of culture, ethnicity and faith of all our students. We are proud of our diversity, and everyone is welcome at our school.

Lowanna College has been told about some racist incidents that have not supported these values. This behaviour is unacceptable and will not be tolerated at our school. We are taking immediate action as part of our commitment to make our school a safe and inclusive place for everyone. Celebrating the diversity of our community makes us stronger, kinder and innovative. We are committed to ensuring that students from all backgrounds feel accepted, supported and are empowered to learn.

Lowanna College has taken steps to ensure the school is a place free of racism and where everyone feels welcome, respected and supported.
