

Liturgical Jottings Lenten Penance and the Synodal Journey

This year's Lenten Message of Pope Francis links the Gospel account of the transfiguration (Second Sunday of Lent) with the year's journey towards the Synod of Bishop on Synodality, He writes: "We can benefit greatly from reflecting on the relationship between Lenten penance and the synodal experience. Excerpts from this year's message will printed here during Lent. Pope Francis concludes his message with:

"Dear brothers and sisters, may the Holy Spirit inspire and sustain us this Lent in our ascent with Jesus, so that we may experience his divine splendour and thus, confirmed in faith, persevere in our journey together with him, glory of his people and light of the nations." © Diocese of Sandhurst 2023

Looking at the Readings

The Readings for this first Sunday of Lent carry several meanings. In the early Christian centuries Lent was the beginning of the year with reading of the beginning of the Bible (Genesis) and the beginning of Jesus ministry in Matthew. It is the time also for preparation of Baptism for the Catechumens and a season of penitential acts for the Christian. It is a journey with Jesus, through the wilderness to the cross and resurrection.

The author(s) of the Book of Genesis present wise reflections on the origins of the universe and humankind and of sin. The readers are also invited to reflect wisely on these texts lest they dismiss them as naive stories containing primitive science and history. We must read and listen with attentiveness and astuteness. The excerpt is brief but set before us life and prosperity, death and disaster (Deut 30:15) and we become seekers of wisdom, faith, truth and life through God's word.

The tempter is crafty and persistent but basically a fundamentalist in his use of scripture to win points and in his misunderstanding on the true nature and mission of Christ as the new Adam (Romans 5) and the Son of God who anointed him and whom Jesus will not deny. Yet Jesus experienced these temptations and told the evangelists who recorded them for our benefit in our journey of self-discovery towards salvation.

Pope Francis Message for Lent 2023

Lenten penance is a commitment, sustained by grace, to overcoming our lack of faith and our resistance to following Jesus on the way of the cross. ... To deepen our knowledge of the Master, to fully understand and embrace the mystery of his salvation, accomplished in total self-giving inspired by love, we must allow ourselves to be taken aside by him and to detach ourselves from mediocrity and vanity. We need to set out on the journey, an uphill path that, like a mountain trek, requires effort, sacrifice and concentration. These requisites are also important for the synodal journey to which, as a Church, we are committed to making. We can benefit greatly from reflecting on the relationship between Lenten penance and the synodal experience.

Prayer for Lent

Lord Jesus, sent by the Father, you came to fight in an immense combat to deliver Adam's children. Grant that we may be so close to you in battle and toil, that we may also share in your victory.

REFLECTION FROM FR PETER

Nelson Mandela said that education was the most powerful weapon we can use to change the world. There would be plenty who would agree with him. One who has agreed is Oprah Winfrey who has said, 'education is the way to move mountains, build bridges, and to change the world'. God's Word suggests the value reading brings. The story from the Book of Genesis comes from pre-history. These ancient of accounts speak when human beings overstretch their boundaries, trouble follows and the experience of harmony and beauty is threatened. Choosing our best of teacher is evident... 'listening to God or the serpent?' The serpent in our day takes on many forms threatening our environmental awareness and other concerns known personally.

The temptations faced by Jesus show some lessons are difficult. Jesus actually teaches the devil! Saying to the devil... "God is in charge!" Jesus expands this, nothing substitutes for an honest and life – giving relationship with God.

Each week during Lent, Caritas Australia asks us to think about a special story. A story from someone who has benefited from generosity through Project Compassion. Lexi who is sixteen from a remote part of Nepal is with us. Our support for Lexi will see her having improved educational opportunities as she sees hope for her community in becoming an engineer. Like her it's the spirit of light showing us all that is possible from our listening and support of her and her Nepalese community.

Allow your generosity through Project Compassion to see young people like Lexi be signs of our monies going where support will be valued.

<u>A STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM</u> The thought of which conjures up many challenging thoughts in particular... How to see more becoming involved in a commitment like many of you who are so good, in keeping your commitment financially to St. Mel's Parish. As I mentioned at our parish finance and management committee meeting recently, "We need to reach out to many who are not with us", in a financial sense and commitment!

Having been part of stewardship programs in other places, and having organized the Archdiocese of Melbourne and their fundraising team, it's my firm belief we here at St Mel's can do something from within our means here. So saving ourselves heaps of money in costing a program!

So for this to happen in a local Parish sense, will require a collective effort in spreading the word to others and in support for a committed effort from all concerned.

I am putting a thought out in the wider realms of our Parish for a committee to help oversee the program in its undertaking

BEFORE the month of AUGUST is upon us much needs to be done. Our next finance and management meeting is set down for THURSDAY 9TH MARCH. It is a collective hope we can achieve some goals of making the financial understanding of our Parish of St. Mel's financially stronger as a parish. Usually such a program will be focused under themes at this stage four words... PARISH, ABILITES, STRENGTHS, VITALITY come to mind we could focus on. These four would give presence to each of the following Sundays in August being, the 6th, 13th, 20th, and 26th. The core values of undertaking a stewardship / planned giving program are:
