Service Updates

Business Support

The Economic Development and Tourism team continue to provide support to businesses through this current COVID 19 crisis.

Closure of Boat Ramps, Piers and Jetties

State Government has advised that all public boat ramps, piers and jetties must be closed for recreational boating and fishing until further notice. Piers and jetties can be used for walkers or people actively exercising.

To ensure that boat ramps remain accessible to commercial users and Emergency Services, ramps will not be physically closed or blocked during this period.

CUSTOMER SERVICE CENTRES Brown Street and Market Place offices will be closed to the public but staff are on hand to take enquiries over the phone (5573 0444) or via email (council@sthgrampians.vic.gov.au).

VISITOR INFORMATION CENTRES Closed.

HAMILTON GALLERY Closed.

HAMILTON CINEMA Closed.

HAMILTON LIBRARY Closed, including mobile library. Scheduled events and programming, will not proceed. Digital services including eBooks, movies, eAudiobooks and more are still available to borrow through library memberships. Contact the Library on 5573 0470 for more information. After hours return chute remains open for returns. No fines and due dates will apply during this period.

HAMILTON PERFORMING ARTS CENTRE Closed. Upcoming events have been cancelled. Contact the PAC (5573 0429) to access a refund for tickets purchased.

HAMILTON INDOOR LEISURE AND AQUATIC CENTRE Hamilton Indoor Leisure and Aquatic Centre (and all associated facilities and programs including Vitality Gym), and all outdoor pools throughout the Shire will be closed.

OUTDOOR POOLS Closed, including early morning swimming.

HAMILTON REGIONAL LIVESTOCK EXCHANGE Will remain open however access to HRLX weekly sales will be limited to buyers, stock agents, transport operators and council staff. The general public will not be able to attend, even if they are sellers.

HOME AND COMMUNITY CARE SERVICES	Operating as normal.
L2P PROGRAM	Suspended.
MEALS ON WHEELS	Service continues to operate as normal, however meals will be delivered to clients by Council staff only.
SENIOR CITIZENS CENTRE	Flu vaccination programs will not be provided through the senior citizens centres this year, to avoid large gathering of at risk persons in one place.
FAMILY DAY CARE	Family Day Care will remain available until the Department of Education advises that the service should not be operated.
HILAC OCCASIONAL CARE	Closed.
MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH	Phone only basis. Anyone who had a scheduled appointment will be contacted by the Maternal Child Health nurses. If face-to-face appointments are required (immunisations, key age and stage appointments) 15 minute appointments will be scheduled. if you are unwell please reschedule your appointment. Contact the Frances Hewett Community Centre on 5551 8480 for concerns or queries.
COUNCIL MEETINGS AND ENGAGEMENT SESSIONS	The May Council Meeting will be held in Hamilton. While this meeting is still open to the public, it is anticipated it be live streamed via council's Facebook page and we would strongly encourage you to engage with the meeting in this format. All other Council organised engagement sessions and events (eg Listening Posts, community meetings) will also be cancelled for the foreseeable future.
REGULATORY SERVICES	Market Place office will be closed to the public. Services will be by appointment only. Please contact 5573 0227.
KERBSIDE WASTE AND RECYCLING SERVICES	Services will continue as normal.
TRANSFER STATIONS	Hamilton Transfer station will be open Saturdays (9:30-4:15). Please note the number of people let inside the gates at any one time will be limited. Electronic payments only. Other transfer stations across the Shire are closed to the general public but remain open to account holders and commercial operators. Anyone who is adversely affected may be able to arrange waste drop off by appointment. Please contact 5573 0444 to discuss.

State Of Emergency For Coronavirus Extended To Save Lives

12th Apr 2020

The State of Emergency in Victoria is being extended for another four weeks to give the Victorian Government the powers it needs to keep slowing the spread of coronavirus and save lives.

Premier Daniel Andrews announced today that the State of Emergency declared last month would be extended until midnight 11 May 2020 to continue the measures designed to 'flatten the curve' of coronavirus and give our health system the best chance of managing the virus. The State of Emergency was originally due to expire on 13 April.

Under a State of Emergency, Authorised Officers, at the direction of the Chief Health Officer, can act to eliminate or reduce a serious risk to public health by detaining people, restricting movement, preventing entry to

premises, or providing any other direction an AO considers reasonable to protect public health.

The month-long extension will ensure the Government can continue its strict enforcement of social distancing, isolation and other vital directions put in place by the Chief Health Officer to slow the spread of coronavirus.

While we are starting to see some improvement in the rate of transmission, now is not the time for complacency. We still have a long way to go. If we relax now, the virus will start spreading quickly and our health system will be overwhelmed.

We thank those Victorians who are doing the right thing by staying at home, but we must keep at it to save lives.

Our message to Victorians hasn't changed: Stay home. Protect our health system. Save lives.

There are only four reasons to leave your home: food and supplies, medical care and caregiving, exercise, and work or education.

Police have strong powers to enforce these directions and can issue on the spot fines, including up to \$1,652 for individuals and up to \$9,913 for businesses. Under the State of Emergency people who don't comply could also be taken to court and receive a fine of up to \$20,000. Companies face fines of up to \$100,000.

Since 28 March Victoria Police have conducted 19,303 spot checks at homes, businesses and non-essential services across the state and issued over 900 fines.
