

A short biography about Fr Maciej Obzazgieweicz SJ:

I am a Jesuit from the northern province of Poland.

I joined the Society of Jesus in 2006 and did my formation in Poland, Ecuador, and France.

Before beginning my Tertianship in Australia, I worked in a network of schools for the poor in South America («Fe y Alegría»), studied for my doctorate (The Question of Charismatic Experience), and was responsible for a retreat house in Warsaw, where I had the privilege of giving Spiritual Exercises.

I am fascinated by Ignatian Spirituality, Theology and basketball. In my free time I like to build with Lego bricks.

Fr Maciej Obzazgieweicz SJ will be leading talks on Ignatian Spirituality.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.

RETREAT IN DAILY LIFE

"We have come to know and believe in the love that God has for us". (1J 14,16) is a four week retreat in daily life, which is an adaptation of

St Ignatius' Spiritual Exercises. The retreat will be an opportunity for you to slow down and **look into your heart together with Jesus.** You will learn basic spiritual exercises, practiced by Jesuits in almost five centuries, that will help you live more consciously, closer to yourself and closer to God.

The retreat is **only** for those who are ready to:

- devote about **65 minutes** a day to various spiritual exercises
- participate in weekly meetings (Holy Mass, conference and introduction to prayer – about two hours)
- meet with an assigned spiritual director once a week or share in group

FEAST OF MARY HELP OF CHRISTIANS



Saturday 24 May is the feast of Mary Help of Christians – the patroness of Australia.

The establishment of the feast has an interesting history, and a unique place in the Catholic history of Australia.

The feast focuses on Our Lady's help to those in need through her intercession to confront sin and to

stand against anti-Christian forces.

Pope Pius VII established the feast in honour of Our Lady Help of Christians in 1815.

After being imprisoned by Napoleon Bonaparte, he established the feast in thanksgiving for his release.

Australia, a new colony at that time, had no Catholic priests and therefore no Mass available.

The faithful recited and relied on the Rosary to sustain the Catholic community.

In 1844, Australia became the first country in the world to have Mary Help of Christians as Patroness.

The tradition of this advocation goes back to 1571, when the whole of Christendom was saved by Mary Help of Christians when Catholics throughout Europe prayed the Rosary.

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REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

Everything is new! There is a new law of love, a new heaven and earth that is established in the church, a new depth of

communion there, and a new glory of God that shines forth from its members.

The new commandment that Jesus announces is more than tolerance or mutual respect. It requires self-sacrificing love. Perhaps the greatest obstacle to this love is the diversity discussed last Sunday. It is hard enough to love those who are like us; how can we possibly love those who are different? And how can we love those who do not love us? It is no wonder that the commandment is called new. It calls for something completely different.

The new commandment is the law of the new heaven and the new earth that are established in the new Jerusalem. Standards are entirely different there. The greater ones serve; the meek possess the earth; happy are the poor; woe to those who laugh. This is clearly a city that comes down from heaven, not one made by human hands. It is a city that embraces all who come to it. God dwells in the midst of this city, in the heart of this people. God dwells with them and they dwell with God.

Through this new love, this new heaven and new earth, this new depth of communion, the glory of God is manifested in a new way. The eschatological future is anticipated in the present. The age of fulfilment has dawned.
