



SMALL IN SIZE, BIG IN LEARNING

Even though Dhurringile Primary School is one of the smallest schools in Victoria, our students certainly don't miss out in their educational curriculum.

Each morning our students are able to enjoy breakfast at school which is supplied by FoodBank Victoria through the School Breakfast Clubs program. Students are able to choose from cereal, toast, fruit, spaghetti or baked beans. In winter, the students can also choose porridge. Dhurringile Primary also participates in Foodbank's lunch program where students can have a variety of soups or packaged meals. Thanks to the generous donations from the Dhurringile Prison, we are also able to offer cheese toasties!







As part of our Italian program, we have been revising our knowledge of colours and numbers. We are now learning the names of 2D shapes. It is interesting to see how some names are very similar to English.

The older students are starting to learn how to write in cursive or joined writing. Some of the students thought it would be quite easy however they are discovering that thinking about the size of the letters, the position of letters on the line, using the correct pencil pressure, making sure the letters are close enough together to actually join as well as having the joins correct takes a lot of concentration.

Each week, we join the Bendigo Discovery Centre for our science lessons. Our current unit of work is titled 'Being a Scientist'. We have been coming up with hypothesis or theories and then conducting experiments to see if we are correct or not. We really enjoyed our experiment last week where we were using our senses of taste, hearing and smell as we got to eat popcorn! Paul grew up in Adelaide, South Australia and attended Nailsworth Primary School and Enfield High School. On the completion of High School Paul worked in advertising and was engaged in general office duties and later as a layout artist.

Coincidently Paul had an association with Murchison in that his German born Grandfather was interned at Camp 13 for 5 years during World War 2.





Paul joined the Commonwealth Police (later becoming the Australian Federal Police) in 1978. Paul served 39 years based in Melbourne and served interstate and overseas. Paul worked in varied areas in the organisation completing his career in an Organised Crime Task Force.

Donna joined the Australian Federal Police (AFP) and served 37 years in total and worked mostly in Melbourne and was lucky to serve interstate and overseas. The areas she enjoyed working in the most were Drug Investigations and Counter Terrorism. It was a very rewarding career and at times a very frustrating one. Donna and Paul made so many friends and a lot have been borrowed as extended family.

Paul and Donna retired in 2017 and ended up back in Murchison. They live on 5 acres have 23 fruit trees, 40 shiraz vines, a vegetable garden and a very fulfilled life.

THE FAITHFUL SOLDIER WINDOW

Christ Church, the Anglican church in Murchison, has some outstanding stained-glass windows crafted by well-respected and skilled artists. They were installed many years ago by local families in memory of loved ones. A notable window dedicated to Major Ernest Gregory who died at Gallipoli in June 1915, and also his 18-year-old sister Muriel, who died in September the same year, was installed by the Gregory family. Major Gregory, aged 33, had only been at Gallipoli for a few weeks when he was killed by a shell during a heavy bombardment. His sister Muriel was a well-loved teacher at the Murchison Primary School and succumbed to a sudden illness only 3 months later. It must have been a very sad time for this family.

The window, beautifully composed of strong colours that have not lost their brilliance although more than 100 years old, depicts a Roman soldier and is entitled The Faithful Soldier. The artists were William Wheildon and George Dancey who worked for Brooks, Robinson & Co., Melbourne.

The leading Australian stained-glass expert, Dr Bronwyn Hughes, visited recently to photograph this particular window as she is compiling a book about the stained-glass windows that are dedicated to soldiers. This publication should be available by August and I am certain it will be a very impressive book. Dr Hughes is most knowledgeable about the windows in Christ Church. She generously shares details of the history of stained glass, also knows the particulars about the artists who created them and the story of the people to whom the windows are dedicated. It was wonderful to spend time with Dr Hughes and learn more about our special windows here in Murchison.

During the summer months, Murchison CFA has been busy on all fronts of fire and accident related activity across both the community area and as support to other

brigades requiring assistance in the management and control of emergency situations.

The key issue this month is that despite recent rainfall we are still under FIRE RESTRICTIONS meaning that fires may not be lit outdoors until further notice. The following notice from CFA District 22 refers to BURN OFF PERMITS.

Fire Danger Period still in force, but farmers can now apply for permits to burn.

With the return to some milder weather, many farmers and landholders will be beginning their burning program in preparation for sowing of crops. District 22 will begin considering permit applications for Schedule 13 agricultural burns only from 4pm Monday 7 March 2022. District 22 includes the Shire of Moira, City of Greater Shepparton and Shire of Strathbogie.

Those seeking a permit should apply via Fire Permits Victoria, the dedicated online site for digital permits at **firepermits.vic.gov.au**

The website allows Victorians to create an account to apply for fire permits during a period when fire restrictions are in place or on a day of total fire ban (TFB). The website also allows a person to notify authorities of the use of a permit during a period when fire restrictions are in place or TFB; and a burn-off during a period when fire restrictions are not in place.

District 22 Assistant Chief Fire Officer (ACFO) Tony Owen said that any burn-offs when fire restrictions are in place require a permit. The permit holder must comply with permit conditions and must notify the planned use of a granted permit through the home page 'Notify' tab or through the Burn-off notification line on **1800 668 511** to reduce 000 brigade call outs.

Lighting a fire in the open without a permit is an offence and can bring a hefty penalty. Under the Summary Offences Act (1966), landowners must not leave a fire unattended as it could result in damage to or destruction of life and property. Landowners still have responsibilities that they must adhere to when burning off. They must strictly adhere to conditions listed in the Schedule 13 permit.

"Under the CFA Act, there is the risk of a fine, twelve months imprisonment or both for people who do not abide by the act" ACFO Owen said. "It is important that all landholders are aware of their responsibilities when incorporating burning off into their farm safety plan and take adequate precautions to ensure that all requirements are met. Any permits issued during the current conditions will include as a minimum requirement 3000 litres of water, 3 adults in attendance and a 4 metre break around the perimeter and 4 metre break around any trees or stands of trees within the area to be burnt. Light up time, not before 1600 hours".

LABOR CUTS CAPACITY OF SHEPPARTON AERIAL FIRE BOMBER

The Andrews Labor Government has cut the capacity of the aerial firefighting aircraft based in Shepparton. Member for Euroa and Deputy Nationals leader Steph Ryan and The Nationals' candidate for Nicholls Sam Birrell joined CFA volunteer Tom Brodie at Shepparton airport this morning to flag concerns about the changes. Ms Ryan said the government signed new contracts late last year which replaced Kestrel Aviation's Bell 212 twin engine helicopter with a AS350 single engine helicopter.

The Bell 212 helicopter has a firebombing capacity of 1500 litres, while the AS350 can carry just 1050 litres. "The helicopter that now sits at the Shepparton airport carries only two-thirds of the volume of water that the aircraft previously provided," Ms Ryan said.

"So far we have avoided a bad fire season this year, but it's only a matter of time before we face fast-moving grassfires or bushfires in inaccessible terrain where aerial support is vital.

"The reduced capability of the aircraft contracted by the government means fires will take longer to pull up and our volunteers on the ground won't have as much support."

Mr Birrell said he was concerned by Victorian Government's decision to downgrade the capacity of Shepparton's aerial support.

"Aerial attack has become vitally important in modern firefighting," Mr Birrell said.

"We need to be upping the ante on the capacity of our fleet, not reducing it. If I am elected, I will lobby the Victorian Government to reverse its cuts to our firefighting capacity."

Ms Ryan said Shepparton's operational base would also no longer be serviced by Kestrel, a local aircraft operator located in Mangalore, after the government handed the contract to Melbourne-based Microflite.

"CFA volunteers have raised concerns with me that Microflite has limited experience in aerial firefighting," Ms Ryan said.

"The government needs to explain why it has handed these contracts to another company which has resulted in a less experienced operator with a reduced capacity.

"Not only are Kestrel Aviation industry leaders, having pioneered night bombing and the use of snorkels to allow aerial appliances to refill from the air, but they are also local.

"Instead of supporting regional businesses, Labor is ripping the rug out from underneath them."
