Geography

In light of the 2024 Paris Olympics, we will begin by exploring the history of the Olympic Games, examining how climate, culture, and physical geography influence the decision to decide on a host country. We will investigate how hosting the Olympics has shaped cities' development, infrastructure, and international reputation. After the Olympics, we'll turn our attention to the Asian continent, discovering its countries, landmarks, and economic interconnections.

Wellbeing

Students will also be working through the Respectful Relationships program and continuing to develop their understandings of the impact of their actions on others and recognising when they are not feeling their best and what they can do to support this.

English

This term, our grade %'s are embarking on a literary journey with Michael Morpurgo's novel War Horse. Through the eyes of Joey, a courageous horse, students will be exploring the themes of friendship, bravery, and the harsh realities of war. The students will share this literary adventure and enrich their understanding of history. Students will be engaging in a variety of writing activities designed to deepen their understanding of the novel and enhance their writing skills. They will begin by crafting expanded

sentences, create narrative pieces based on their own animal character and finally, they will write persuasive pieces of writing. These writing pieces will reinforce their comprehension of the text and also encourage them to express their ideas creatively and persuasively. We look forward to sharing their work and celebrating their progress in these areas!

Maths-

Students will be focusing on the concepts of Fractions, Data, Angles and 2D and 3D. Students will develop these skills through explicit teaching sessions, guided practice and independently working through tasks and investigations. Students will continue to develop their abilities to verbalise the steps in which they used to solve equations and represent their findings.
