Works alert - Bonbeach utility relocations

The Victorian Government is removing 18 dangerous level crossings and building 12 new stations as part of a \$3 billion upgrade on the Frankston line that will improve safety, reduce congestion and run more trains, more often.

Works are continuing on the Edithvale, Chelsea and Bonbeach level crossing removal project with strict health and safety protocols in place.

The health and safety of our workers and the community will remain our key priority as we undertake works on the Edithvale, Chelsea and Bonbeach level crossing removal project.

We will continue to follow the directions of the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) as we safely complete works on this project.

Works taking place

To prepare for level crossing removal works in Edithvale, Chelsea and Bonbeach, utility services such as electricity, water, gas and telecommunications are being upgraded and relocated along Station Street and Nepean Highway and surrounding side streets.

From **Wednesday 4 November to early December**, works will take place on Station Street, near the York Street intersection to enable underground water and sewer upgrades and relocations.

From **Thursday 12 November to mid December**, works will take place on Breeze Street between Patterson and Station streets, and on Nepean Highway.

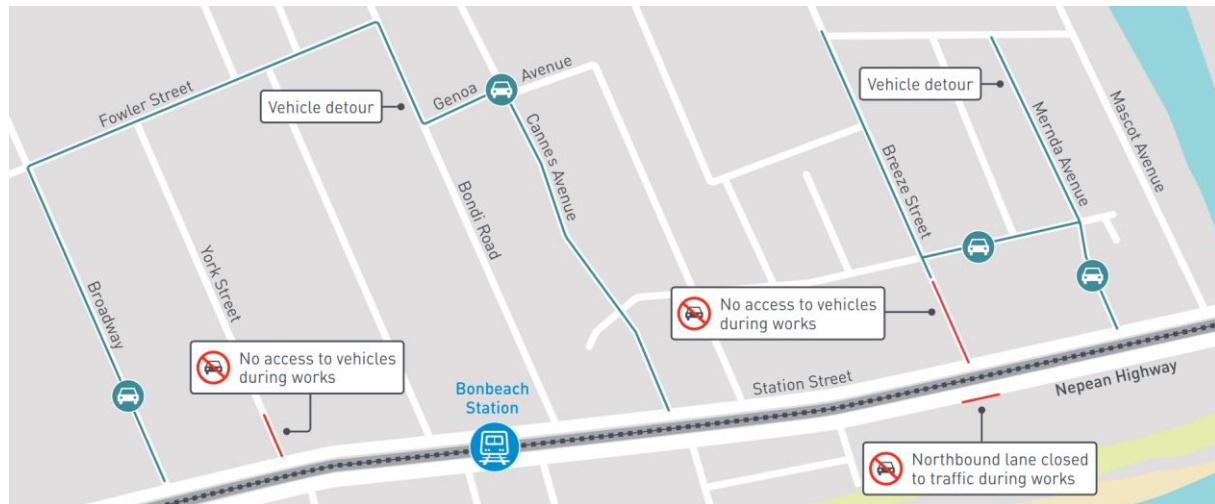
Traffic changes

- York Street will be closed to traffic at Station Street at times between **Wednesday 4 November** and **early December**.
- Breeze Street will be closed to traffic at Station Street at times between **Thursday 12 November** and **mid December**.
- Northbound lane closures on Nepean Highway at times during works, with traffic management in place to ensure traffic is maintained in both directions.
- Vehicle access to driveways may be impacted at times during these works. Advance notice will be provided to residents prior to works impacting driveway access taking place. Pedestrian access will be maintained.

What to expect

- Construction workers, vehicles and equipment will be onsite undertaking the works.
- There will be moderate noise from machinery, such as excavators, while works take place.
- Local detours and traffic management to help you move safely through the area.
- Reduced on-street parking adjacent to work areas.
- Works will take place from **7am to 6pm Monday to Friday, and 7am to 3.30pm Saturdays** - If any works are required outside these times, we will let you know.
