We also have Section Volunteers who work tirelessly to support the smooth running of our variety of competitions and displays at the Royal Show. The assistance from these volunteers enables the visitors to see prize winning animals, produce and other displays.

There are also interesting customer service roles either in the Information Booth, roving around the ground or meeting and greeting patrons at the various entry points.

How does Volunteering at the Perth Royal Show work?

- Shifts are 3 hours in length (morning, early afternoon and later in the afternoon) and are available for the eight days of Show, Saturday 21st September to Saturday 28th September.
- Student volunteers work in pairs and will be provided induction in the lead up to the Show, with full support during shift/s.

- Free entry on the day of volunteering
- Complimentary Show entry ticket for each day you volunteer, to use on another day or give to family and friends!
