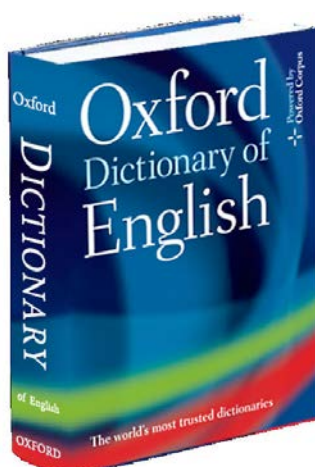
- The "sixth sick sheik's sixth sheep's sick" is believed to be the toughest tongue twister in the English language.
