To successfully complete your VCE, you must satisfactorily complete:

- A minimum of 16 units by the completion of Year 12
- Three units of an English subjects including <u>Unit 3 and</u>
 4 English.
- Unit 3 and 4 studies in at least **three** other subject areas.




VCE Requirements – Attendance

- If students miss an assessment task or SAC, they must submit a medical certificate.
- VCAA has a minimum attendance requirement to pass
 - GNLC's attendance requirement is stricter at 90% (VCE handbook)
- NOTE: planned absences during school term for any student requires an application in writing to the principal to ask for permission to be absent from school.
 - Extended absences for students doing VCE is not advised and may not be granted permission.
 - No scheduled absences (overseas trips etc) during school term for any student doing a Unit 3/4 subject unless there are unique mitigating circumstances.



Year 12 2023 (Post Secondary Pathways)




55 Students:

53 students applied – all students received an offer as at 13 January (round 1), either through VTAC or direct offers. 14% of students receiving more than 1 offer.






Victorian Tertiary Admissions (VTAC)
