This year, we are celebrating 150 years of Ceres Primary School! It's an exciting milestone, and we can't wait to bring our school community together to celebrate. There will be special events, activities, and opportunities to reflect on our school's rich history.

#### Morning routine

Term 1 is all about setting up routines and expectations. Students can enter the school and classroom between 8:35-8:45am to unpack their bags, set up for the day, and then head outside to play. If arriving earlier, they must wait in the bus shelter area until supervision begins at 8:35am. On wet days, students

can play inside under teacher supervision.


We encourage independence by having students enter the classroom on their own and complete their morning jobs. Some will pick this up guickly, while others may need more time. As the term progresses, we ask parents to drop off at the door or bus shelter to support this transition. If your child needs extra support, please reach out to their teacher so we can work on a plan together. As always, we appreciate your support.

#### **Assembly**

Every second Friday at 2:30pm, we have our school assembly. Families are welcome to come along and support our 2/3 students—it makes them so happy to see you there! Each assembly, some students from our class share what we've been learning. If your child is getting an award, your teacher will let your family know. Awards include Principal Awards, Stretch the Brain Awards, and GEM Awards (Resilience Project). We can't wait to see you there!

#### English

This year, our English program has undergone exciting changes in line with the new Victorian Curriculum 2.0. Unlike previous years, where we dedicated one lesson each to Reading and Writing, we are now implementing a comprehensive 2-hour English block that integrates all aspects of Literacy. Our new English blocks will cover daily reviews, phonics, handwriting, spelling, fluency, vocabulary, comprehension, and writing, giving our students a well-rounded approach to language development.





Students are strongly encouraged to read daily at home to support their literacy development. To assist with this, we have introduced great new reading logs, created by The Resilience Project, which include a daily reflection. These reflections incorporate our GEM principles of Gratitude, Empathy, and Mindfulness, providing students with a valuable opportunity to engage not only with their literacy skills but also with their emotional wellbeing. This initiative promotes a balanced and holistic approach to learning. Additionally we celebrate students reading nights with certificates starting at 25 reading nights!


#### Maths

We will be kicking off the Term with a focus on solving a variety of Maths problems through our new '20 days of Maths' framework. During these sessions, students can learn, explore and apply problem solving strategies such as drawing diagrams, working backwards and creating tables to help scaffold their thinking and problem solving (see example prompts below). Following this, we will dive into **Place Value** and **Shape** before closing out the term with a focus on **Position and Direction.** 

These sessions aim to further translate students' understanding of concepts and skills to real life applications in order to enhance their numeracy.

Lessons will follow our regular lesson model of Warm up, Explicit Teaching, Independent Work/ Clinic and Reflection with a Challenging Maths Task implemented regularly throughout the week following our 'Launch/ Explore/ Discuss' model.

It is really important for students at this stage to be confident when recalling basic addition and subtraction sums and there are many great resources to practise this recall (songs, Mathletics live, MyNumeracy games) that your child can use at home. Students can access their Maths learning goals through Seesaw. These will guide their work in class but will also align with MyNumeracy activities that they can access while at home.



#### Inquiry



This year, our Inquiry learning will explore a range of engaging topics that connect to different curriculum

areas, encouraging curiosity, critical thinking, and hands-on experiences.

This term, students will explore their identity, connections to people and places, and the **geography** of Australia. They will also begin an All About Me focus, discovering identity, family, and connections to different places. Through geography, we will investigate maps, locations, and how our surroundings shape who we are.

In Term 2, we will dive into our school's rich **history** as we celebrate its 150th anniversary. Students will learn about changes over time, personal and community histories, and how our local environment has evolved.

Term 3 will focus on **biological science** and living things, their life cycles, and the ways they interact with their environment. Students will explore native plants and animals, linking their learning to sustainability projects within the school.

To finish the year, students will focus on **health**, wellbeing, and personal development in Term 4. They will explore topics such as nutrition, physical activity, and emotional wellbeing while continuing their environmental efforts to enhance our school grounds.

Throughout the year, our environmental focus will be woven into each topic, encouraging students to take pride in their school and make a positive impact on their surroundings. We look forward to an exciting year of learning and discovery!

#### **Values and Resilience Project**

Values lessons are a highlight of our Mondays! Each afternoon, we dive into our exciting new 3 R's: Respect, Resilience, and Responsibility. These engaging sessions complement our Respectful Relationships curriculum, making learning both fun and meaningful!

Additionally we have our Resilience Project lessons, happening every second Thursday (see the timetable below). Each student will be working on their very own 'Resilience Project' journal.

Teachers and students will come together for fun, engaging lessons and activities every two weeks, focusing on the key principles of Gratitude, Empathy, Mindfulness (GEM), and Emotional Literacy to build that all-important resilience!

#### **Term 1 Swimming program**

The 2025 swimming program will cover water safety, education and confidence around pools, lakes, rivers and beaches. These are important skill for all students to learn. The program will run from 3rd-7th March 2025. Students will be transported each day by bus to Leisurelink Waurn Ponds. Students will need to wear their bathers under their school uniform each day to make the transition into the pool as quick as possible. Those students who do not have permission or payment will have an alternate program at school. Students must commit to all 5 days of swimming (unless arrangements are approved prior to the event for exceptional circumstances or due to absences from illness, etc)

# Seesaw

We use the SeeSaw app to keep you informed about what we do at school. On SeeSaw, we share students' weekly spelling words, their spelling tests, learning tasks, and fun updates on our activities. We invite you to get involved by liking and commenting on student posts, cheering them on for their

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hard work and achievements. This collaboration helps strengthen the connection between home and school, fostering a supportive learning environment for our students.

#### ICT & iPads

In line with Department policy, our Acceptable Use Agreement document has been updated for the 2025 school year. Your child's classroom teacher will be going over this in class and discussing it with them before signing it this week (and the following week for those on camp). A copy of this must be signed by students at school to acknowledge the safe and responsible use of online technologies at Ceres Primary. Once signed, this will come home to families where we ask that parents sign the acknowledgement and return to your child's classroom. Teachers will also be discussing the policy with students throughout the term through eSmart lessons.

#### Houses

At Ceres Primary School, we have two houses—Lok Lok Eagles (Yellow) and Kanyul Kangaroos (Green).
