



Tuesday April 14	Primary schools (State and some Catholic) distribute a Year 6 to Year 7 Transition Pack (including an Application for Year 7 Placement form) to parents of Year 6 children.
	Parents who have a Year 6 student in an Independent Primary School can visit the MGC website (www.mgc.vic.edu.au) to download an enrolment form.
Tuesday May 5 *Subject to change due to Covid-19	Due to COVID-19, a face-to-face Information Night cannot be held in 2020. A virtual meeting will occur at 7.30pm, and a recording made for any families that are unable to attend. Further details will be available from the MGC website closer to this date. Please note: No registration is required
Friday May 29	Parents return Application for Enrolment (Year 7) Form to their primary school (State & some Catholic) by this date.
	Applicants currently attending an Independent school to return the Application for Enrolment (Year 7) Form directly to Melbourne Girls' College by this date. (Attention: junior_enrolment@mgc.vic.edu.au)
Tuesday June 23 *Subject to change due to Covid-19	Students to whom Melbourne Girls' is not their closest neighbourhood school and those who do not have sisters currently enrolled at the College are invited by email to participate in an Additional Information Form. *Please note - The format of this session will potentially take place virtually. • Applicants whose surnames are between A & K are asked to participate between 4.00pm-5.00pm. • Applicants whose surnames are between L & Z are asked to participate between 5.00pm-6.00pm.
Wednesday June 24 *Subject to change due to Covid-19	If the student is unavailable for either time on Tuesday June 23 they have an opportunity to complete the Additional Information Form.
Wednesday August 19	Primary Schools notify parents of placement applications. MGC will notify parents of independent school applicants. Melbourne Girls' College may from this day communicate with parents of their future Year 7 students. Families may commence to lodge an appeal with MGC.
Monday August 31	Closing date for parents to Lodge an appeal with MGC regarding placement.
Friday September 11	MGC to notify all families who have lodged an appeal with outcome.
Friday September 25	Closing date for families to lodge an appeal with Regional Director.
Friday October 30	Regions notify parents/carers of outcome of RD appeal.
Tuesday December 8	Orientation Day for Year 7, 2021 students – 8.30am to 2.30pm.
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

Enrolment Process:

Students applying for placement at Melbourne Girls' College will be enrolled in the following priority order:

- 1. Students for whom the school is the designated neighbourhood school.
- 2. Students with a sibling at the same permanent residence who are attending the school at the same time.
- 3. 50% of places remaining after criteria 1 and 2 will be allocated to students seeking enrolment on specific curriculum grounds which are the study of Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics S.T.E.A.M.
- 4. Remaining places will be allocated to students in order of closeness of their permanent residence to Melbourne Girls' College.

In exceptional circumstances, a student may be enrolled in a school based on compassionate grounds. This is an overarching consideration and does not form part of the priority order of placement. Families who wish to apply for compassionate grounds may do so during the appeal process, outlined in the Year 6 to Year 7 Enrolment Timetable for 2021. Families should provide any relevant documentation along with their compassionate grounds appeal and address this appeal to Stephanie Valencia, Year 7 Enrolment Officer at junior_enrol@mgc.vic.edu.au.

If MGC is not your designated neighbourhood school

- Friday, May 29 Return your Application Form to your Primary School (Government schools) or MGC directly (Independent/Catholic schools): Attention: junior_enrolment@mgc.vic.edu.au . MGC must be listed as the first preference
- Tuesday June 23 Students will be invited to attend the virtual MGC Additional Information Session
 - Students will respond to four questions relating to STEAM
 - Applicants whose surnames are between A & K will attend from: 4.00pm–5.00pm; L & Z: 5.00pm–6.00pm
- The criteria for assessment are:
 - Demonstrates capability and interest in at least one of the following areas - Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics
 - Demonstrates authentic student voice
 - Uses clear examples from the students' own learning to support statements made in response to the questions
- A selection panel, made up of four members of MGC staff, rank the responses based on the criteria above.


