Pope Leo XIV

We unite with Catholics from our local church, from Australia and all around the world to give thanks to God for the election of our new Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, the 267th successor of St Peter.

Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, OSA, born in Chicago, Illinois. He joined the Augustinian Order in 1977, served in Peru for more than 20 years, first as a missionary and later as bishop of Chiclayo.

Pope Leo XIV, the first Augustinian and American Pope, brings decades of missionary, pastoral and curial experience to the papacy. He was appointed prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops in 2023 and played a key role in shaping episcopal leadership globally.

Taking the name Leo XIV, the new pontiff situates himself in a lineage of reformers and bridge-builders. He urged the church to strive to be a missionary church, a church that walks closely with those who suffer, that builds bridges, that is a place of welcome and fosters dialogue.

In his Urbi et Orbi address, the new pope emphasized the humble and persevering peace of the Risen Christ, which comes from God's unconditional love. He reminded the world that: "God loves us, ..., and evil will not prevail!"

On 9 May, Archbishop Peter A. Comensoli of Melbourne congratulated Pope Leo XIV and offered prayers on behalf of the local Church as he assumes the role of successor of Peter. He prayed for the Holy Spirit to guide the Pope with wisdom, courage, compassion, and strength, entrusting his ministry to the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Augustine, and giving thanks for his leadership at this pivotal moment.

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (ACBC) extended also their heartfelt congratulations to the new pope, expressing hope and confidence in his leadership. (Melbourne Catholic, May 2025)



First Reading Acts 14:21-27 A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.
