> The Future of Cyber Security

Cybercrime is an increasing problem in our digitally connected world. The rapid growth of cybercrime has created unparalleled opportunities for those with cyber security expertise, with jobs in the Database & Systems Administrators & ICT Security sector predicted to increase by 38.9% by November 2026 according to Australian Government data.

Job roles in this specialised field of IT include - information security officer, security administrator, cyber security consultant, cyber security analyst, penetration tester and many others.

Many industries are realising the importance of cyber security, and a degree in cyber security can lead to employment in diverse areas across private and government sectors. Deakin's courses are industry-specific, so students graduate with up-to-date knowledge of the issues important to the industry – like implementing security technologies to protect against hackers or developing IT security solutions. Students can undertake an internship and complete industry cyber security certifications as part of their course. This means they can stand out to future employers and be ready to take advantage of the significant increase in jobs in the field.

> The Difference between Financial Planning, Finance, and Accounting

Financial planning, finance and accounting are all offered as majors in the <u>Bachelor of Commerce</u> at Deakin. When choosing between these options, it is important to fully understand where each course leads.

What is financial planning?

Financial Planning is a pathway to becoming an accredited financial planner. Financial planners help people devise a plan to achieve financial security and meet financial goals.

As well as developing strategies and recommendations, financial planners act as life coaches, educators, and mentors.

It's a profession that combines an interest in finance and investing together, with a love of working with people and while a level of numeracy skill is required, interpersonal skills are the primary focus. Graduates work in small and large financial planning organisations or set up their own practice.

What is finance?

Finance specialists have an in-depth understanding of the structure and operations of financial markets in Australia. They typically work within large organisations at the corporate level in roles such as treasury, project funding, investment banking, financial analysis utilising their strong numeracy and analytical skills. Careers in finance allow graduates to work across industries and provide specialised advice to aid complex business decision-making.

What is accounting?

Accounting is a pathway to becoming an accredited accountant. Businesses and individuals rely on accountants to assess their financial situation and advise on financial dealings. Graduates work with organisations compiling, analysing, verifying and preparing financial records. Strong numeracy and analytical

skills are required for this role and, depending on the size and type of organisation, accountants may work with clients or solely with internal stakeholders within a business.



Essendon Education Academy

Essendon Education Academy and RMIT University offers a unique qualification perfect for the sport enthusiast. It provides students with access to elite high-performance facilities and key industry experts in the area of sports and entertainment.

Hosted at the NEC Hangar, home of the Essendon Football Club, students will undertake a dual Diploma of Business and Diploma of Leadership and Management in a one-year full-time program.

Throughout the full-time program, participants will build a network and develop connections in the sport industry as they complete 100 hours of real-life work experience across Essendon's various departments and partner network.

Entry requirements are successful completion of an Australian Year 12 or equivalent certificate (including VCE, VCAL or VCE VM).



VU Guaranteed: Victoria University's Early Entry Program

Open to domestic and onshore international students

Requirements: Year 12 pass^^

Guarantee your place at Victoria University (VU) or VU Polytechnic, prior to completing Year 12.

Students can apply for VU Guaranteed (VUG) if you are a Victorian Year 11 or Year 12 student studying VCE, school assessed (unscored VCE), VCE Major and IB.

Successful VUG applicants can enjoy:

- a guaranteed place at VU or VU Polytechnic
- free access to EdUnlimited practice exams, topic guizzes and study notes
- 5 bonus aggregate ATAR points for most courses that consider an ATAR as part of the admission criteria*
- tailored advice and a personalised course plan once results are released

*Excluding the Bachelor of Education (P-12)

<u>Note</u>^^: Students will still need to satisfy the admission requirements/prerequisites for the courses they preference in VTAC. Students who do not meet the admission requirements, will be guaranteed a place in an alternative course designed to help them achieve their goals. Therefore, the course offer students receive will be based on their course applications/preferences and on study scores + other admission requirements etc.

Students without an English study score, or a score below 20 for example, will not be offered a higher education course (university), and would instead receive a course plan with TAFE course options.

Applications are now open and close on 6 October 2023. **Students must also make a VTAC** application. Applications have now opened online at <u>Victoria University's Early Entry Program</u>.





Studying at the Melbourne Cricket Academy (MCEA)

Start your career in sport with the Melbourne Cricket Education Academy (MCEA).

Launched in October 2022, and the first of its kind in Australian cricket, MCEA students are based at Cricket Victoria in the CitiPower Centre at Junction Oval in St. Kilda. The Academy is a unique opportunity for select students to kick-start a career in sport while studying a dual Diploma of Business and Diploma of Leadership and Management delivered by RMIT University.

In addition to the dual diploma, students will have the option to select from two elite sporting streams: the Cricket Development Program — where students will spend one day per week (on average) undertaking a range of cricket technique development activities at the CitiPower Centre in St Kilda, **OR** the Sports Business Placement Program where students undertake 100 hours of real life work-experience provided across Cricket Victoria including Melbourne Stars and Melbourne Renegades and its partner network.

Entry requirements are successful completion of an Australian Year 12 or equivalent certificate (including VCE, VCAL or VCE VM).

New Certificate III in Travel

The new Certificate III in Travel course is ideal for those wishing for a career in retail or, corporate travel, travel related events, airline operations, wholesale travel or wishing to become a broker or travel booker. The course will give students the hands-on skills needed to work in the everchanging travel and tourism industry. Up to three reservation systems will be taught along with fares and ticketing, product costing and selling and the course also includes up to date legal and consumer laws and agency obligations. This is a 6-month intensive course and cannot be done part time.

Allied Health Careers

There are many types of allied health professionals, including **dietitians**, **physiotherapists**, **podiatrists**, **speech pathologists and psychologists**. Doctors, nurses and dentists (and other oral health professionals) are not allied health professionals. Some allied health specialisations are detailed below.

Audiology

Audiology is a health care profession involved in assessing, managing and rehabilitating *hearing loss* and *balance disorders*. So, audiologists are responsible for the non-medical management and rehabilitation of hearing loss and associated disorders of communication. Audiology is a rapidly growing profession and qualified audiologists are in high demand both locally and internationally. To become an audiologist students usually have to study a biomedicine, biological science, health science or a related field at university, followed by a postgraduate qualification in audiology. In Victoria, two universities offer a Master of Clinical Audiology:

- La Trobe University Master of Clinical Audiology
- University of Melbourne Master of Clinical Audiology

Orthoptics

Orthoptists are *eye care professionals*. They specialise in detecting, diagnosing and treating *vision and eye disorders*. To become an orthoptist, a student usually has to study orthoptic or ophthalmic science at university.

In Victoria, La Trobe University offers the <u>Bachelor of Orthoptics (Honours)</u>.

Podiatry

Podiatrists look after the *health of people's feet* by diagnosing, treating, and preventing foot abnormalities, and educating the public about good foot health. Undergraduate courses in podiatry are offered by two universities in Victoria:

Nursing – Division 2 (Enrolled) Courses in Victoria in 2023

Division 2 or Enrolled nurses are trained with the full spectrum of nursing qualifications, and these skills include communicating with patients, working in a team, medication, and clinical nursing duties. To become an Enrolled nurse, one must complete a Diploma of Nursing. The VCE entry requirement for the diploma is a Year 12 pass. On completion of the course students will be eligible to apply for registration as an Enrolled Nurse with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) or go on to further study to become a Registered Nurse. Note: The Diploma of Nursing is currently a Free TAFE course in Victoria. Students are advised to browse VTAC for a comprehensive list of all nursing courses.
