Literacy

This Term, as the Olympics are upon us, we will be using this as a springboard in our Literacy lessons. We will be using a variety of non-fiction text types to read with a purpose so that we can access information about the Games, Athletes and events. Through reading, students will gather lots of information and use it in their writing, where we will learn about writing different types of non-fiction text types. By the end of the term, students will have created their own Olympic Journal and an information report about an Olympic athlete, country or event. Students will then present these to their peers as a presentation. We look forward to sharing this collection of work with you on SeeSaw and Open Day later in the term.

Numeracy

In Term 3, we will continue to work on extending students' place value knowledge to numbers beyond thousands and explore operations including multiplication as repeated addition and division as repeated subtraction. We learn more about addition and subtraction strategies to solve money and measurement problems. Students will build on their knowledge of time, building their fluency to tell time to the hour, quarter hour and half hour. We will use balance scales to investigate mass as well as explore other metric units of measurement through real life applications. Students will have opportunities to build their problem solving and reasoning skills through challenging maths tasks weekly with varying levels of challenge to suit all learning abilities.

At home, all students have access to Mathletics, which is a great tool to reinforce learning from the classroom through interactive game-based learning. Students have their passwords in their diaries or saved on their iPads. If your child is having any difficulties with logging in at home, please see one of our friendly teachers for assistance.



Inquiry

We will take a little rest from the garden this term and focus more upon the Olympics. Students will be working on a variety of engaging activities to build their geographical knowledge and citizenship skills. Students will compile all their work in a journal, which hopefully becomes a keepsake for the future to remind them of the 2024 Olympic Games. Keep an eye out on SeeSaw for work updates.
