PREP

In Term 1, our Preps will be developing their foundational digital technology skills! They will explore key functions of digital systems, learning how hardware and software work together to serve different purposes.

With assistance, students will begin logging onto their Chromebooks using passwords and accessing iPads with a code. They will practise essential computer functions, such as saving their work, moving the cursor, and scrolling within a file. The Preps will also develop confidence in navigating programs and applications and recognising different icons on the screen.

We will also explore online safety through discussions, modelling safe internet use, and talking about appropriate online behaviour, such as sharing photos responsibly. To build their keyboard skills, the Preps will be using the Typing Tournament program, helping them become more familiar with letter placement and finger positioning.

GRADE 1/2

This term, the Year 1/2 students will develop their skills in using different digital systems to capture and transfer data. For example, they will use an iPad to take a photograph of themselves or a peer and email it to themselves. They will also complete various email tasks, including sending an email to another student in our school community to introduce themselves. Through discussions with teachers, students will learn to apply safe practices to protect themselves and others while interacting online for learning and communication. We will also explore cyber safety when using online information systems, such as understanding that passwords help protect personal identity.

Each lesson will include a component focused on developing keyboarding skills using the Typing Tournament program.

GRADE 3/4

In term 1, the Year 3/4 students will develop their digital technology skills and build confidence in using technology for learning. They will learn essential digital skills, such as navigating online tools and using Gmail as a means of communication to send and receive information responsibly. With teacher guidance, students will identify and list the major steps needed to complete a task. They will also complete various email activities, including email protocols and sending an email to another student in our school community to introduce themselves.

Each lesson will include a component focused on developing keyboarding skills using the *Typing Tournament* program.

Through Google Classroom, students will enhance their learning while developing independence and responsibility. They will learn to access learning materials, track assignments, and manage their digital tasks. With guided use, they will also improve their file management skills.

Additionally, students will learn about cyber safety, including password protection, privacy, and responsible online behaviour.

GRADE 5/6

In Term 1, Year 5/6 students will focus on planning, creating, and communicating ideas and information through online collaborative projects. They will develop essential communication and presentation skills, using digital tools effectively for learning and teamwork.

Students will practise online communication, including composing and responding to emails using appropriate language and etiquette. They will also refine their digital communication skills, such as writing messages, posting comments, and interacting respectfully online.

To enhance their keyboard skills, students will use Typing.com, learning proper finger placement to reduce reliance on looking at the keyboard. Improved typing speed and accuracy will help them complete tasks, emails, and projects more efficiently.

Structured task management and file organisation will also be a focus, helping students identify and sequence the necessary steps to complete digital tasks efficiently. They will learn how to create, name, and store files in cloud-based systems for easy retrieval. A key priority will be cyber safety and digital etiquette, ensuring students understand responsible online behaviour, privacy, and the impact of their digital footprint. They will develop their awareness of password security, privacy settings, and appropriate online conduct, including respectful communication and the importance of using appropriate language and content when engaging online.

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
PREP
