The Shepparton Education Plan will transform student outcomes, by empowering all students to learn and achieve, experience high quality teaching practices and the best conditions for learning which equip them with the knowledge, skills and dispositions for lifelong learning and shaping the world around them.

Education specialists from the Department of Education and Training (DET) and key stakeholders have developed the plan. This included interviewing principals, teachers, parents, students and community groups to build a complete picture of education and community needs.

The new school will provide a more inclusive environment with a greater emphasis on individual learning with all the required wrap-around supports. This will improve opportunities for our young people to meet life's challenges, build resilience and reach their full potential.

Following community consultation and engagement, the architects, Gray Puksand, have now commenced the detailed design which is including input from students and teachers. The designs will be completed in the first quarter of 2019.

The Master Plan includes the following design features:

- 3 Neighbourhoods:
 - Each Neighbourhood will be made up of 3 adjoining Houses and a multi-storey building connecting them with shared learning spaces.
- 9 Houses:
 - Each House is a multi-storey building that will include classrooms, resources spaces, breakout learning zones and specialist areas for approximately 300 students.
- Specialist Spaces include:
 - A specialist and technical hub, including a STEM Centre of Excellence
 - A wellbeing hub incorporating community resources
 - A staff 'centre of excellence' for professional learning
- Sporting and recreational facilities
