Adaptability and the jobs that need it

Adaptability is a core skill that means you're able to rapidly learn new skills and behaviours in response you are able to respond to change, appropriately.

This could mean that when things change at work for example you take on a new role, or the boss installs a new system, you are able to adjust quickly to the new situation and continue your work with the minimum disruption.

Why is adaptability an important skill?

Employees value workers who can keep working and being productive under any circumstances.

People with low adaptability, take longer to get used to new environments, workplaces and situations, and the people around them will have to compensate.

Adaptable people find it easy to settle into new workplaces or roles, adjust quickly to problems or hurdles when they arise. Adaptable people can often help other less-adaptable individuals to transition into new work settings and processes and may often be considered for leadership roles.

Not sure if you're adaptable?

Ask yourself if you:

- Are flexible and willing to learn
- Accept change in a positive manner
- Try new things
- Are self-motivated
- Don't give up easily or get discouraged
- Are creative

If you can answer yes to most of the above then the chances are you already an adaptable person.

Become more adaptable

To be adaptable, you need to be able to:

- Understand why the change has occurred
- Proactively seek ways to modify your behaviour to meet the new situation
- Adjust your mindset to suit the new way of doing things

You can make yourself more adaptable by:

- Getting outside your comfort zone, frequently. Say yes to opportunities and participate more, you'll soon find that you're less phased about change
- Learn from other people who you think are adaptable. Ask them for tips or guidance, watch how they behave and make a mental note to try that next time
- Look for the positives even when things don't go right. You could learn to successfully review and refocus, it could also be valuable when you're presented with challenges next time
- Take chances. That might mean you make some mistakes, but if you learn about what went wrong then test alternative solutions until you find the right one, you'll learn some valuable tips and tricks along the way

Jobs that require adaptability

Police Officer – You'll be dealing with a lot of unpredictable situations as a Police Officer, so you need to be able to quickly adapt and keep calm.

Executive Assistants need to work with a variety of systems, like computers and diaries, and keep up with the changing schedules of important people.

IT Support Officers – Technology is constantly evolving, so you'll need to be adaptable to keep up with the constant changes.

HR Managers – Working with people requires you to be adaptable so you can deal with all kinds of situations.

There are lots of things you might not be able to predict as a **Farmer** – weather, crop and animal health, and changing technologies are just some of the things you'll need to be prepared for. Being highly adaptable can make your job as a farmer easier and less stressful.

Birthing babies can be a high-stress situation, so you need to be calm and adaptable to handle anything that might happen when you're working as a **Midwife**.

Trends and fashions are constantly evolving, so to be a **Fashion Designer** you'll need to be adaptable to keep up with the latest in fashion and design.

Project Managers need adaptability to be able to integrate various moving parts of a project and deliver a quality product or service in a timely manner.

Increase efficiency and productivity

What do Systems Analysts do?

Systems Analysts are responsible for analysing, improving, and maintaining business and IT systems for businesses and organisations. They evaluate the programs and procedures currently in use, identify any problems, and propose and build solutions to increase efficiency and ease of use.

Systems Analysts will often collaborate with other important stakeholders, such as Business Analysts, management, and other IT professionals, as well as end users.

If you are thorough and analytical, have a knack for everything tech, and want a job in a fast-growing area, becoming a Systems Analyst could be ideal.

- Analytical and precise

- Average hours for full-time workers: 42 hours a week, which is average (source: joboutlook.gov.au).
- Systems Analysts' salary (average) \$100,000* per year (source: seek.com.au). *Salaries vary depending on your skills and experience.
- Future career growth: Very strong (source: joboutlook.gov.au).
- Most of your work will be done indoors, and you will be doing lots of work with computers. You might work in-house for a business or organisation, or be hired externally under a contract.

- You might be expected to work overtime to fix critical issues, and sometimes work odd hours (early mornings or late nights) to ensure there is minimal disruption to systems during business hours.

How to become a Systems Analyst in Australia

You will most likely need a formal qualification in order to work as a Systems Analyst in Australia. Without one, you will need to be able to demonstrate extensive experience.

Step 1 – Complete Year 12 with a focus on English, Maths and IT.

Step 2 – Complete a VET course, such as a [Diploma of Information Technology](#).

Step 3 – Consider upskilling with an undergraduate course, such as a Bachelor of Computer Science or Bachelor of Information Technology.

Step 4 – Take short courses to build other essential skills, such as coding, programming, and database management.

Step 5 – Start working as a qualified Systems Analyst and continue to build your skills and knowledge.

Systems Analysts use their combined tech and business knowledge and skills to improve and implement new systems for a business or organisation.

Which industries employ Systems Analysts?

Systems Analysts are mostly employed in the Professional, Scientific and Technical Service industry.

You might start out working on small projects for small businesses, before eventually moving up to work on large-scale projects for some very important clients.

Do I need to go to university to become a Systems Analyst?

Many employers are seeking people with formal qualifications. You might be able to find work without one, but you will need to demonstrate lots of hands-on experience.

Where do Systems Analysts work?

There is demand for Systems Analysts across most of Australia, particularly in Victoria and the Australian Capital Territory.

What are 3 things I can do right now to help me become a Systems Analyst?

If you're in high school and you'd like to find out if a career as a Systems Analyst is right for you, here's a few things you could do right now:

1. Start taking short courses to build on important skills, such as coding and database systems. There are lots of courses you can take online, or even at your local TAFE or VET provider.
2. See if you can find work experience in an IT or business-based setting. This will help you see if you might enjoy the work, and can help you start building important contacts for the future.
3. Talk to a Systems Analyst to see what a day in their life is like. If you don't know anyone, see if you can watch videos or documentaries about a career in IT or business.
