Applying for the Tuckwell Scholarship at ANU

You must apply for the Tuckwell Scholarship by 10 April 2022.

As a Tuckwell Scholar you will receive:

- \$23,000 per annum (2022 rate) (increasing with inflation) each year for the length of your undergraduate degree program (studying full-time), to cover on-campus residential costs, books and general living expenses
- guaranteed access to ANU-approved student accommodation

If you are applying for the Tuckwell Scholarship you must submit a direct application to ANU by 6 April 2022.

Applying for Medicine courses

Note that when applying for Medicine courses you must do the following:

- **Sit the UCAT – Bookings close on 17 May**
- **2022 and you must sit the UCAT between 1 July to 12 August 2022.**
- **Do a Direct Application to the University** - only applicable for UNSW and Newcastle/UNE Joint Program. Not required for the USYD and WSU/Charles Sturt Joint Program.
The link for UNSW direct application is [Prospective Students - Faculty of Medicine, UNSW](#). The link for direct application at Newcastle University/UNE is [Key Dates - Joint Medical Program - The University of Newcastle, Australia](#). Applications for these have not opened yet but will close on 30 September 2022.
- **List the course/s on your preference list in UAC by 30th September 2022** – You can make your UAC preferences from 1 April 2022 when UAC applications open. This step is required for all University Medicine courses in NSW.
- **Attend an Interview if requested to** – This is required for all University Medicine courses but the criteria on which they decide on whether you have made it to this step will vary from one University to the next. For example, USYD will base it on the ATAR (as you are not required to sit the ATAR for the USYD course), whereas UNSW will base it on the ATAR and UCAT.

NSW Police Force – Recruiting Eligibility Quiz and Certificates You Need

Take the quiz to see if you may be eligible to commence an application to the NSW Police Force.

- 'Aquatic Rescue Sequence' certification: Applicants are required to provide certification of successful completion of the Aquatic Rescue Sequence.
- First Aid certification: Applicants are required to supply certification of completion of an approved 'Apply First Aid' course with at least 12 months currency remaining on certification.
- Typing certificate: Applicants are required to supply a recognized certificate of typing proficiency equivalent or greater than 25 words per minute at 98 percent accuracy.

Australian Federal Police Officer Steps for Entry

There is a seven-step process to becoming an Australian Federal Police officer:

- Register
- Pass the AFP Entrance Exam
- Pass the fitness assessment
- Complete a detailed application
- Pass a medical and psychological assessment
- Pass a security assessment
- Attend the two-day Assessment Centre course.
