Celebrations and Events

- St Fidelis proudly hosted the **STEM MAD Showcase**, which was a huge success and a great initiative by our school.

Learning and Teaching

- It has been fantastic to see students growing in confidence during Learning Conversations.

Enrolments

- Enrolments continue to be strong, with **42 Prep students already enrolled for 2026** (capped numbers).
- Our projected student population for 2026 will be **258 students**, with particularly high interest from Year 2 families.

School Fees

From 2026, school fees will increase by 9.5%, bringing the total to \$2,354 per family. This
change reflects Government requirements for schools to increase their Capacity to
Contribute (CTC) by 2029.

- Grade 3 results were outstanding, above the national standard in many areas.
- **Grade 5** results remained strong but highlighted areas for continued growth, particularly in numeracy and spelling.
