# Studying the Bachelor of Design at Melbourne

What is design, and why is it important? Designers analyse the world as it is, so that we can come up with how it could be!

So, why study the <u>Bachelor of Design</u> at Melbourne? The students learn from 'making and doing'; they learn a lot through real-life scenarios, they learn through experience, and they learn through connections between disciplines. So, students sit and learn alongside architects, landscape architects, engineers, etc. – very much like the real industry.

Design students have access to twelve majors, and must do at least one, although they can do two. Alternatively, students can opt to do one major and a specialisation – a short sequence of subjects focusing on a particular theme within design. Students also have

access to electives – non-compulsory subjects within the Design degree, and breadth subjects – subjects from outside of the Design degree.

Students in the Bachelor of Design get a very rich student-experience. From Work Integrated Learning, Internships, Volunteering, and Overseas Exchange opportunities. Students might also choose to get involved with the <a href="Design Student Society">Design Student Society</a> (DES). DES runs events open to all Bachelor of Design students, from a first-year O-Week camp to themed parties, free pizza lunches, boat cruises, trivia nights and many other smaller events. DES is organised by a committee of current students. Students have the chance to network with students from other year levels, get involved and receive academic and social support.

Another valuable opportunity is for students to participate in *Peer Assisted Study Sessions* (*PASS*). These are *free* weekly sessions, led by a student who has successfully completed the subject in a previous year, and is a great way to maximise engagement with ones studies and enjoyment of those subjects. Interestingly, students who attend PASS are consistently shown to achieve better results than those who do not attend.



# **Toploma of Teacher Education Preparation**

The **Diploma of Teacher Education Preparation** may be the right study choice for students with the motivation, capability, and personal attributes to be a great teacher.

The *Diploma of Teacher Education Preparation (Dip TEP)* is an accredited AQF5 level qualification aimed at students who do not initially meet the minimum ATAR for teaching. The course was developed as part of the <u>Victorian Government's Excellence in Teacher Education Reforms</u> to ensure that disadvantage and diverse educational experiences are not a barrier to capable and committed people who want to pursue a career in teaching.

Successful completion of the Dip TEP will ensure students graduate with the prerequisite knowledge and skills to undertake an undergraduate teacher education course. The Dip TEP supports students to meet the literacy and numeracy standards they will need in order to graduate with a teaching qualification and supports them to meet the demands of study at a higher education level. The course introduces them to contemporary issues in education and to teaching as a profession, including practical school-based placement.

The course is offered by various institutions including ACU, RMIT, Swinburne, and Vic Uni.

## Career in Digital Marketing

The <u>SEEK</u> website indicates that *Digital Marketers are responsible for the promotion of products or brands through one or more digital media channels, such as search engines, social media, email, websites and apps to connect with current and prospective customers.* 

<u>Wikipedia</u> suggests that Digital Marketing is the component of marketing that uses the Internet and online-based digital technologies such as desktop computers, mobile phones, and other digital media and platforms to promote products and services.

Tasks and duties of Digital Marketers include:

- Developing marketing strategies.
- Managing content generation, ad campaigns, social media, emails, customer relationship management software, search engine optimisation.
- Tracking KPIs such as shares and impressions on social channels, conversions in search channels and open and click-through rates in emails.
- Analysing campaigns to identify what did and didn't work, and whether time and money can be better spent.
