Curriculum/PYP

- **PYP inquiry approach**; conceptually driven under transdisciplinary themes.
 - Developing knowledge, concepts, skills, attitudes and action.
 - Collaborative interdependence; developing communication, conflict resolution.
 - Current Unit 'Give Peace a Chance'
 - CI Efforts to maintain peace and resolve conflict can help humans to live harmoniously.
- Stand alone developing other areas of learning that aren't authentically linked to the inquiry.
- Maths Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry, Statistics and Probability
- Literacy Reading and Viewing, Writing, Speaking and Listening
- Reading at home: personal reading, reading aloud, being read to, audio books; this is a valuable and powerful experience.
- **Philosophy** Facilitate higher order thinking; critical and creative. Supporting the children in their development as thinkers, articulating that thinking and with justifications, but also to be flexible have the propensity to change their minds when new ideas and information are presented.
